Timotheos Child Sponsorship: This year as part of our mission donations, we have requested to sponsor a child in Malawi on behalf of the school. His name is Isaki Time, and he is 9 years old. Our sponsorship will provide:

- 1) 1 meal a day, 5 days a week
- 2) Bible lessons, and basic education including English and Chichewa languages
- 3) A sleeping mat, blanket, and mosquito net
- 4) Support with basic medical needs
- 5) 1-2 sets of clothes
- 6) Sunday school

Isaki lives with his mother and his two younger brothers. His father left them to look for work in Mozambique in 2021 and has not returned. His mother has a leg condition which makes walking and manual labor difficult for her. They live in a small house with a grass roof and dirt floor. A garden and one fruit tree provide a small amount of food for the family.
