Thanksgiving Baskets: A big thank you to the school community for your outpouring of gifts this year. We were able to pack up 8 large boxes of your food contributions and 8 large boxes of perishable items which included a turkey or ham, mashed potatoes, gravy, stuffing, chocolate, rolls, and a large pumpkin pie. Also, we had two large bags-one filled with nice warm gloves and mittens, and another one filled with warm hats. We topped each bag and box with homemade "Thanksgiving cards" made by the elementary students. In addition to this, we collected \$399.71 of which \$264.00 went to purchase the perishable items. We have \$135.71 left which we hope to use in the near future when we serve a hot lunch at the Tree of Life school. Mr. Adam Sterenberg, principal of the Tree of Life school, received our gifts and spoke to the students about how the Lord opened the door for him to start this school for low income families. They started with 12 students and now have 80 students. They have the privilege of providing these students with a Christian education.
