A panel of Consulting Rosarians will be featured at our April 4 General Membership meeting to tell us about becoming a Consulting Rosarian. Here is a list of some of the necessary application requirements:




- 1. Membership in the American Rose Society for 2 years
- 2. At least 5 years of experience growing roses.
- 3. Successfully complete a Consulting Rosarian school.
- 4. Active member of a local rose society.
- 5. Be at least 18 years of age.
- 6. Send a completed CR candidate form to your district CR chair 30 days before CR school.
- 7. Accrue 4 continuing education credits every 4 years.
- 8. Other requirements based on CR form and District.

Come, see, hear and get your questions answered at our April 4 meeting. It will be the perfect time to ask the **Consulting Rosarians** questions you may have regarding soil preparation for planting, pruning, when to fertilize and what and when to spray for pests. There's always sometime new to learn!

Also in April, FVRS leadership will share announcements regarding the addition of a juried **Photography section** to our 2024 Rose Show and how FVRS is joining social media via **Facebook**. Be sure you get to the April meeting to hear all the exciting news!

The purpose of the society is to encourage interest in and cultivation of the rose and to spread the love of the rose to our community. Our annual rose show is one of the primary ways to accomplish this. Please consider supporting our 2024 show at one of the following donation levels:

Here are some things to know about our rose show:

- It provides a venue for rose growers across the Pacific Northwest to share their roses with the public.
- It is open to the public with no admission or participation fees.
- Roses are judged by ARS (American Rose Society) certified judges.
- In each category, winners are recognized with ribbons. The top winners receive special recognition.
- Education and awareness concerning roses are two key parts of the show.
- Knowledgeable members and judges are on hand to answer questions from those attending.
- The show is the second largest in the Pacific Northwest and one of the largest in the U.S.

More about FVRS and what the accomplishments of its members through many volunteer hours:

- Maintain the Esther Short Rose Garden and the Covington Rose Garden, both free to the public.
- Conduct free seminars on rose cultivation and care at local nurseries.
- Offer free consultations to persons who are seeking advice on growing and identifying roses.
- Hold monthly meetings that promote the rose and provide information on the care of roses.
- Give presentations to local organizations who desire to know more about roses.
- Plan, prepare and present the annual rose show.
- Maintain a web site (<u>www.fortvancouverrosesociety.org</u>) making information available to all who are interested in roses.


A Picture is Worth a Thousand Words










Weather Word

Well, March came in as a lion (at least at my house) and went as a lamb, appropriately for Easter. I can remember in Atlanta, Easter was on April 12 and there was snow, wind, and 19-degree temperatures that not only ruined my roses but every suburban garden as well. No thank you.

Anyway, El Nino is rapidly decreasing, and ocean temperatures will be near normal into the summer when La Nina could start forming due to colder than normal temperatures are present in some areas of the Pacific Basin. By fall, the outlook is for La Nina begin in earnest. But for now, the rest of spring looks quite warm with drier than normal rainfall likely as a large-scale upper-level ridge begins to settle in over the U.S. and rather dry, which will be welcomed after a month of damp, cloudy weather. And, after a decade of above normal summer temperatures, who can argue with a hot summer outlook with scant rain across the PNW.


