A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER

As December draws to a close, it feels important to pause – not just to reflect on the work for December, but to look back on the year as a whole. 2025 has been a year of growth, courage, challenge, and extraordinary community, and I am incredibly proud of everything PEAK has achieved together.

This year marked five years of PEAK. Five years of listening to families, advocating for change, and building a charity rooted in understanding, lived experience, and hope. What began as a response to unmet need has grown into a trusted source of support for families locally and nationally, and 2025 has truly shown how far we have come.

That progress has been recognised in ways that still feel humbling: Peak's award for the South Gloucestershire Community Hero Award in February, and then the BBC Make a Difference Community Award in September, and, most significantly, achieving National Autistic Society Accreditation in November – a defining moment for PEAK. These recognitions are not just milestones. They are not by luck. They are a reflection of the trust families place in us and the standards we hold ourselves to every single day in order to support you and make real change.



None of this would be possible without the incredible generosity shown through fundraising efforts this year. From the unwavering support of The Woodland Family, Poad Family, and Jones Family to the determination behind Jenson's Challenge and Sian's London 10K, every fundraiser carried a shared purpose: to create change and ensure families are not left navigating alone.

Their own unique Peaks for PEAK challenge brought families together in a powerful show of community spirit...not forgetting my own personal challenge that pushed boundaries; the climb of my life to the summit of Monte Rosa and a 100-mile journey from Gloucester to London with Karl Howe to support The National Autistic Society. These moments were demanding, but they symbolised exactly what PEAK stands for: perseverance, purpose, and possibility.

2025 was also a year of strong partnerships and invaluable supporters. We are deeply grateful to The Brothers Trust for their incredible backing, Tesco's Community Grants, Footfall Direct for their grants for materials, Ecotricity for their generous Donation and our first Patrol of PEAK, Dale Vine, The Provincial Grand Lodge, Souter Charitable Trust and Sixteen Gallery for their kind donations, Golden Valley donation and opportunity to work together, BBC Radio Gloucestershire for our incredible award and supporting us during our 100mile walk, TSB Banking Group PLC collaboration, BBC News working with Reform for Neurodiversity, ADHD UK support in our community sessions and PEAK DAY and Bloodhound Education for their fantastic science based programmes, and so many others who believed in our mission and helped amplify our voice. Each partnership helped PEAK reach further, support more families, and challenge outdated narratives around neurodiversity.



Our community events continued to be the heart of PEAK this year. From the biggest SEN event of the year, PEAK Day and our Forest School sessions during half terms, to PEAK's Christmas Disco, SATIREV in Bath, and engagement with schools including Denmark Road High School Careers Day, Alderman Knight Summer Fair, and Finley's Community School, every event created spaces of inclusion, understanding, and connection, spreading our mission and encouraging those to reach out for support.

We also loved bringing joy and appreciation through our competitions – from The Green Way Mother's Day giveaway to Delta Force Paintball for Father's Day – small moments that reminded families they are seen, valued, and celebrated.

Above all, I want to thank the families. Thank you for trusting PEAK, for reaching out during difficult moments, for sharing your stories, and for walking alongside us. Your courage and openness are the reason PEAK exists, and it is a privilege to support you.

And finally – the biggest, loudest, most heartfelt thank you goes to the PEAK team. Your dedication, compassion, and tireless commitment make this charity what it is. You show up, you listen, you advocate, and you create change every single day. Being part of something so genuinely life-changing is only possible because of you. Thank You.

As we step into a new year, PEAK remains committed to doing more, reaching further, and standing firmly beside families – with understanding, advocacy, and hope.
