When Mia first joined PEAK's Forest School last year, her family didn't know what to expect. She was completely non-verbal, struggled in new environments, and often became distressed when she couldn't express herself. Attending groups was overwhelming, and family life was filled with worry.

Fast forward to today, and the difference is remarkable. Mia now looks forward to Forest School. She has built friendships, begun using words, and joins in with joy and confidence. Her mum describes her as "happy to attend, making friends, using words and getting involved" – a transformation that shows what the right environment can do.

Much of that success comes from the team. Staff like Leigh have been central to Mia's progress, building trust and creating bonds that help her feel safe. Her mum says they have been nothing short of phenomenal.

PEAK's support also extends to families. Whether it's guidance on education, attending key meetings, or helping parents feel heard, we are there every step of the way. For Mia's family, Marco's advice and advocacy made a huge difference, ensuring Mia received the best opportunities.

Importantly, no child should miss out because of financial hardship. PEAK provides a place with activities, and resources so families can access everything we offer. Every child deserves to thrive, regardless of circumstances.

The more tokens we receive, the more funding we can secure to continue empowering families and supporting neurodiverse children.

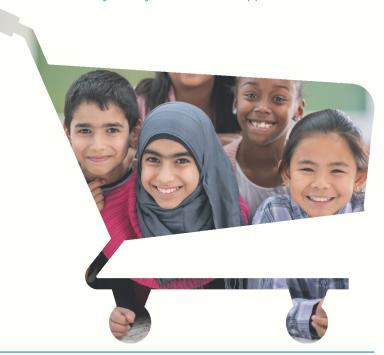
Thousands of votes have already gone in – so many that stores have had to empty and restock the token chips more than once, a powerful reminder of the love and support our community shows for our charity.

What matters most is setting a goal that's meaningful to you.

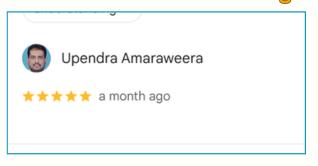

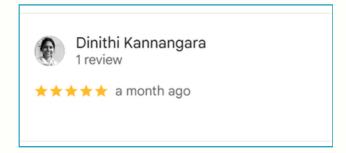

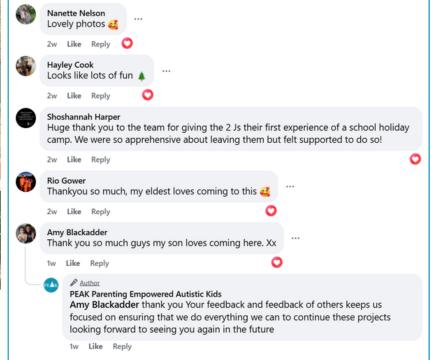
