

Virtual Tea & Banter By Tina Griffiths

At my Virtual Tea & Banter meeting (via Zoom) on Tuesday 12th November 15:00 HRS, we have a guest speaker, Derek Plews, author of "A Brilliant Little Victory" giving a presentation about the 48th (South Midland) Division on the Western and Italian fronts during the First World War.

The presentation will include its successful defence of a critical position on the Asiago Plateau in June 1918; charting the history of the division from 1908 when it was established and its initial deployment in 1915 on the Western Front; participation in the Battle of the Somme; and its role in the Third Ypres offensive in 1917.

It was 48th Divisions' successful defence of the tactically important Asiago Plateau high above the Lombardy Plain on 15 June 1918 that contributed to the defeat of Austro-Piave with potentially disastrous results. Despite fighting an effective defensive action, subsequently described by one officer as 'a brilliant little victory', the Divisional Commander, Major General Dir Robert Fanshawe, was sacked and sent home much to the dismay of officers and men. In seeking to understand what lay behind

the shocking removal of an apparently successful commander, A Brilliant Little Victory provides a detailed analysis of the battle and factor that may have contributed to this sacking before offering a conclusion about whether or not it was justified, given the standards of the era.


