# VETERANS RENDEZ VOUS POINT (RVP)

Nestled in the North Bedfordshire countryside, just over the border from Northamptonshire, lies the village of Sharnbrook where a small farm is the venue for the Veterans Community Network Rendezvous Point (known as the RVP). This a smallholding where Veterans can come together in a safe, friendly

place to participate in many different activities.

During the finer months produce is grown such as, lettuce, pumpkins, chilies,

cucumbers and tomatoes, to name a few and this year we are building a Memorial Garden with a Memorial bench for those who wish to sit in quiet contemplation. There is also a small orchard where apples, plums and pears grow in abundance so they need harvesting at various times too.



We are currently in the process of building a new Hub which on colder days will serve as a warm place where veterans can play board games, have a game of cards or just get together for a friendly chat. Tea, Coffee and biscuits are always available and if you're lucky....homemade cake.

### STANDING WITH GIANTS

'D' Day 6<sup>th</sup> June 1944 - "For your Tomorrow the Peoples Tribute- Normandy 80"

On Monday 26<sup>th</sup> February we attended the Standing with Giants event at Stanton Harcourt, Oxford.

The organisation creates large scale art installations of military figures using re-cycled building materials and provide meaningful spaces for people to visit and reflect. Some of our Veterans were able to take part in painting the silhouette's, which stand around 10 feet tall, and will undoubtedly become part of history.

A total of 1,745 silhouettes by 'Standing with Giants' will appear in Spring 2024 on the Normandy Beaches in Vel-sur-Mer, representing the number of British fatalities under British command on 6<sup>th</sup> June 1944.

The Founder Dan Barton says: "Our ethos at Standing with Giants is to value life, to understand and appreciate why we have our freedom, and to remember and pay tribute to those who have fallen so we can live the lives we have today. 'Standing with Giants' is a great way of using art to do this".

Sentiments of one of our Veterans who attended the event: "I visited Standing with Giants in Oxfordshire and the job they do is absolutely fantastic which is all for the love of those who made the ultimate sacrifice. First of all we watched a video which was very emotional and the making and painting of the figures was just amazing. As a Veteran myself, to be part of that particular part of history was one of the most moving things I've ever done."

# THE LONGEST YARN – THE LONGEST DAY

The Yarn Bombers are a knitting group from Oundle who are currently putting the finishing touches towards a stunning 80 metre long D-Day display of the largest seaborne invasion in history.

They are part of an international team of crocheters and knitters, that was founded in France, who are helping to mark the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D- Day. In total 80 different groups from around the world will each be contributing a hand-crafted metre long display which involves ships crossing the channel to the landings on the beach and the Oundle Bombers will be focusing on Pegasus Bridge.

As the largest seaborne invasion in history, D-Day was a pivotal moment in the Second World War and the 'Longest Yarn is a play on words of the 'Longest Day' a quote made by German Field Marshal Erwin Rommel.
Once complete the full display will be exhibited in the Normandy Cathedral at Carentan from June until September 2024.
Before the Oundle Bombers exhibit joins the others in France it will be on display at:

# The Hub, Fletton House, Oundle PE8 4JA on Thursday 21st March 10.00 to 15.00.

A piper will be playing "Blue Bonnets over the Border" which was the tune piped by Piper Millin as British Troops pushed forward on that day 6<sup>th</sup> June 1944. In addition to this, yarn supplied by Piper Millins' son is that of his Fathers' jumper.

So please come and join VCN as we will have a stand at this wonderful historical event.

#### In Memoriam



Francis O'Connell

14/02/43 - 13/12/23

Francis was an RAF veteran. Having joined as a boy entrant he completed his 18 month training and passed out at RAF Hereford in 1961. During his 12 years' service, he was posted to RAF Khormaksar in Aden in April 1963 and in 1964 was awarded the Campaign Service Medal for services in the Radfan mountains, 60 miles North of Aden. Tina met Francis in the Spring of 2021 in her role of 'Elderly Veteran Engagement Lead' for the Veterans Community Network and over the next two and a half years, she visited him almost every week as he had no close family and was very isolated. When Tina first visited him, Francis did not have a working boiler and had to rely on two plug in radiators to heat his house. Tina successfully applied on his behalf for a grant from RAFA to pay to repair his faulty boiler and replace two rusty radiators to ensure he had proper heating over the Winter. She also arranged for volunteers to completely clear his front and back garden which were severely overgrown and to dismantle and remove his decrepit shed. Francis O'Connell passed away on 13<sup>th</sup> December 2023 aged 80. His funeral was held at Crownhill Crematorium in Milton Kevnes on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2024. Tina Griffiths and Pat Haslam from VCN both attended his funeral and Tina gave the Eulogy. Thank you for your Service.

# USEFUL INFORMATION

#### **VETERAN CARDS**

The Ministry of Defence has been working closely with the Office for Veterans' Affairs to develop a new digital service to enable veterans who left the Armed Forces prior to December 2018 to verify their veteran status and receive a Veteran Card in the post.

Veteran Cards have two primary functions: to ensure that veterans can quickly verify their status to access public and charitable sector support if they need it and to provide a recognition of service in the Armed Forces. The service was officially launched at the end of January 2024.

You can apply if you were in the regulars or reserves for the:

- Royal Navy
- Army
- Royal Air Force (RAF)
- Royal Marines

What you'll need

When you apply, you'll be asked for:

- · Your service number
- Your National Insurance No.
- The approximate year you started and ended your service - it does not have to be exact
- A recent digital passport photo, showing your head and shoulders

### VETERAN RAIL CARD

Another card that you may be interested in is the Veteran Rail Card.

This gives you a 1/3 off most rail fares including Standard and First Class Anytime, Off-Peak and Advance fares to Veterans across England, Wales and Scotland, whether they are visiting family and friends or simply enjoying a day out.

A 1-year Veterans Railcard costs just £30. If you want to get more for your money, the 3-year Veterans Railcard is great value at £70, saving you £20 on the cost of renewing your 1-year Veterans Railcard for three consecutive years.

You can also nominate a companion to get 1/3 off when travelling with you and up to 4 children travelling with you get 60% off.

If you have served for at least one day in Her/His Majesty's UK Armed Forces (Regular or Reserve) or have been a UK Merchant Mariner who has seen duty on legally defined military operations, you may be eligible.

The Veterans Railcard is available to buy online and by post, and you can choose to have it on your phone (digital) or to have a plastic card posted to you.

#### A COLONEL'S ORDER

#### SERGEANT TO SQUAD:

"When it rains tomorrow at 2000 hours, the phenomenal 75-year-old General Halley, accompanied by the Colonel, will drive his comet through the battalion area theatre in fatigues."




