Music Notes

Tom Paulson, Director of Music & Worship

My friend Pastor Reggie tells about his first call, as a youth pastor in a large ELCA congregation in a small Minnesota town. Early on he was confronted with a difficult situation. Several members of the congregation objected to a pregnant, unmarried teenage girl participating in his youth group. He reminded them of another pregnant, unmarried teenage girl. Ironically, her name also was Mary.

As Lutherans, we don't seem to honor Mary, Mother of God, as much as other Christian traditions. We read her story every year, but really only because of her connection to Christmas. Her story is one of faith, trust, hope, and perseverance in the face of great adversity. It is also a story of God's great justice.

Following Pastor David's sermon, we'll sing ELW 723, Canticle of the Turning, a vigorous Irish jig. Notice the words of waiting and trusting:

"My heart cries out with a joyful shout, that the God of my heart is great, and my spirit sings of the wondrous things that you bring to the ones who wait."

Notice also the profound and troubling refrain. It is either words of warning, or words of comfort and reassurance.

"My heart shall sing of the day you bring.

Let the fires of your justice burn.

Wipe away all tears, for the dawn draws near,
and the world is about to turn."

In 2025, a year of wars, political unrest, social disconnection, fear, etc., perhaps Mary's story is our story more so than ever.
