Dear Friends in Christ,

In the Parable of the Great Feast, Jesus tells the story of a man hosting a feast where none of his invited guests arrive. He then sends out his servants to find everyone they can and bring them to the feast so "that my house may be filled." I believe God's desire for us is the same as the host in the parable, that our house of worship may be filled. What would it look like if St. Mark's was filled today? Allow me to share my vision with you.

I see a church where children are embraced at every stage of life. Where an infant cries during service and their parent feels the support of their church family. A church where the seeds of faith are planted in our young people by their participation in the life of a church where their prayers and hopes for themselves and the world are heard and affirmed. I see a church where generations of families worship together, and where youth and seniors learn from one another.

I see a church where the doors are flung wide open, where strangers become neighbors and where neighbors become friends. A church where divisions of class, race, gender, and politics give away to our oneness in Christ. A church where those wrestling with their faith feel as at home as those who've never had a doubt. I see a church where discipleship is fostered by fellowship, service, and faith. A church known for its hospitality and for its support of the larger community.

I see a church where people are nourished through worship. A church where the music is as diverse and varied as God's people, where songs familiar and new are sung with equal enthusiasm, and where people's talents are shared and celebrated. A church where the Gospel is preached faithfully and the Word challenges, comforts, and inspires. A church where worship is not viewed merely as an obligation to God but as an incredible gift to ourselves, and where those who are sent out go in peace to serve the Lord do so in their daily lives.

One of Lutheranism's core theological ideas is "already but not yet." It is this idea found in scripture that the Kingdom of God is already here but not yet fully realized. Luther's understanding of us as sinners and saints is another expression of this idea. The same understanding can be applied to us as a congregation. The things I've laid out in this vision are already happening among us each and every day. You can see them and you have seen them. We are being filled but we are not yet full. In this stewardship season, I am asking for your help as we continue the work of fully realizing this vision for our congregation.

Friends, we've been able to do so much together these past few years. The spirit of our congregation is strong and the seeds we have been planting together are bearing fruit. In order to sustain and build upon the work we've been doing together we need the financial support of people like you.

A PLACE AT THE TABLE: Sustaining core ministries

In a time when many churches are being forced to make cuts and consider closing their doors, we made the commitment to invest in our core ministries of Music and Children, Youth, and Families (CYF) because we know the future of our congregation depends on it. Because of these strategic investments our Music program is stronger than it has been in years and our renewed CYF ministry is planting the seeds that will bear much fruit in years to come.

BRIDGING THE GAP

We have to sustain these core ministries if we are to build upon our momentum and ensure a place at the table for this generation and the next. Sustaining these ministries requires our annual giving to increase by \$125,000 over the next several years.

In January our congregation approved a budget with expenses that exceed current giving levels by \$125,000. This was a bold move and we were able to make it for two reasons. One, we have the right leadership under Pastor David, Deacon Kate, and our Worship & Music Director Tom Paulson and we know they are committed to our vision for the future. Two, we have reserve funds that allow us to bridge the gap between expenses and giving in the short term. We expect to have strong leadership for years to come but our reserve funds cannot be counted on forever. To carry us into the future we are counting on one another. To gets us towards our goal we are asking everyone to do what they can.

YOUR FINANCIAL SUPPORT IS IMPORTANT

If you are not currently giving regularly in support of our life together please consider adopting this spiritual practice and become a giver. If you are a current giver we are asking you to increase your regular support by 7% or more if you are able. With your sustaining financial support we can ensure everyone at St. Mark's has a place at the table for years to come.

A PLACE AT THE TABLE: Sharing in life together

A few years ago we began to think of our Wednesday night meals, education, and worship as Act2. This was inspired by the example of the early church found in chapter two of The Acts of the Apostles. That first community of faithful were committed first and foremost to following the way of Jesus but also deeply committed to one another as a community. They did everything As Church Together.

The early church was a diverse group of people. They came from different backgrounds. They occupied different rungs on the socioeconomic ladder. They had differing views about world in which they lived. And yet they were one through their faith in Christ. When they gathered as church together they did so as sisters and brothers, as beloved children of God. Whatever their differences they remained one people in Christ.

ONE THROUGH FAITH IN CHRIST

To live as church together means sharing in life together. It means breaking bread together, playing together, laughing together, crying together, serving together, leading together, praying together, rejoicing together, and worshiping together. - 48 number of children who attended VBS
- 500 number of people who attended Trunk-or-Treat
- 233 households who made a commitment to financially support our mission in 2024
- 93 households who give electronically

CORE MINISTRIES UPDATE

When thinking about filling our house, our place of worship, and having a place at the table for all people, this vision cannot be complete with the youngest among us present. We have rallied behind our youth this past year in some very significant ways. With the help of the Foundation, and the generosity of the congregation, we were able to send ten teenagers to the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans, requiring families to only pay the deposit fee. We also hosted nearly fifty children for full-day Vacation Bible School where we provided lunch and snacks Monday through Friday at no cost to our families. Having programming and opportunities available to our families is one thing, keeping them accessible is another. We have worked hard together to do just that, to be able to show up so that all children and youth get to participate fully without creating a hardship or strain on their family. Creating community and filling our space, inside and out, is a wonderful thing. This fall, we were able to celebrate with our KidsFest in the parking lot with over one hundred church and neighborhood families. St. Mark's is striving to be a place of joy and welcome for all people, not just those of us already on the inside. I look forward to the new ways we can fill this house together in the year ahead.
