## Music Notes

Tom Paulson, Director of Music & Worship

*We Shall Overcome* became a prominent theme song in the early day of the Civil Rights Movement. This song was often referenced in the speeches and sermons of Dr. Martin Luther King (1929-1968.) While the origins of this song are not clear, it is speculated that the opening melodic phrases of the song were inspired by the African American Spiritual No More Auction Block for Me. Portions of the text were likely derived from Charles Albert Tindley's (1851-1933) gospel song I'll Overcome Some Day. The day after the funeral of Martin Luther King, Blacks and Whites held hands in the streets of Atlanta and sang this anthem of unity and social justice. (Rollo Dilworth, arranger, and Professor of Choral Music Education at Temple University, Philadelphia.)

**Black History Month** (February) honors the vital contributions, achievements, and culture of Black Americans in arts, science, politics, and beyond.

**Women's History Month** (March) honors the vital contributions, achievements, and culture of women in arts, science, politics, and beyond. As we worship in February and March, we'll specifically incorporate readings from black and women theologians, poets, and leaders, and music of black and women composers and musicians to help us all more deeply understand their contributions.
