#### **Music Notes**

Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, They shall be like the tree planted by the water, that extends its roots by a stream. (Psalm 1)

It is fortuitous or a God-thing, I'm not sure which, that Psalm 1 was assigned for Sunday, September 7, and that we tend to sing our psalms for several Sundays in a row. This Psalm talks about how a tree thrives and grows, even in heat and drought, when it is near water. It can be nourished, thrive and even still bear fruit in the most difficult of seasons because of its access to water. Think about an oasis in the middle of a desert, and how animals come to drink and plants thrive there, because of the water.

If we are like a tree, then God and our community is like the water. We can survive and even thrive in the most difficult of times nourished by the Spirit of God's word, and uplifted and supported by the community of believers. In the words of the Psalm, "It will not fear when the heat comes, but its leaves will be green."

For me this song has become an earworm in the last week or so, considering all the boiling tensions in our country. When we extend our roots toward the stream, or less metaphorically, come to worship and take part in our community of believers, we hear the word of God. It speaks to our souls, calms our minds and informs our actions. May the word and the community continue to bless us, and through us, may the world be blessed.
