Music Notes

God is here! As we God's people meet to offer praise and prayer, May we find in fuller measure what it is in Christ we share.

Some hymns are big picture hymns. They help us wrap our minds around important ideas in broad, general ways. "Jesus loves me, this I know, for the bible tells me so" is a perfect example. Our Gathering Hymn is definitely not a big picture hymn. It is more like a sermon in song. It goes into great detail why we come to worship, what we are trying to accomplish as we worship, and why we should encourage others to join. I've noticed that these Sermon Hymns often need some study or analysis to help them come to life and enrich our worship. Otherwise, their details get lost in the singing.

It starts with a big concept, "God is here!" and, as you see by the quote above, quickly explains why that is important. The poet speaks of the symbols whereby God speaks to us – from the table, the pulpit, the baptismal font, and the cross. The poet takes special note of having children in worship, and gives us, the children of God, a new, true, but rather uncomfortable name, the servants of the Servant. The poet wraps it all up with a sort of benediction, "in an age of change and doubt, keep us faithful to the gospel; help us work your purpose out." I'm grateful for the encouragement and the help, because I know this is something we cannot do alone.

Living a good life, a Godly life, isn't easy, as we all know so well. We need to know and be able to articulate both the big picture and the details. So the next time you're humming Jesus Loves Me, go to the hymnal, find ELW 526, study the poem, and give thanks to God for the big picture and the details.
