## Music Notes

Tom Paulson, Director of Music & Worship

I like the way we in the liturgical worship tradition celebrate Christmas. Our culture seems to forget about Christmas on December 26, but Lutherans, Catholics and Episcopalians have a good month of preparation, Advent, then 12 days of Christmas joy and festivities, culminating in Epiphany (technically January 6, but today, January 4, is close enough), the arrival and adoration of the magi. In our culture the story of the magi, lumped in with the birth narrative, gets short shrift. But it is a story rich with hope, joy, peace, light, and promise. The magi are the first to declare Jesus's divinity with their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And they came from foreign lands, a reminder that God's love and grace is universal.

As we celebrate Christmas one last time, one last hurrah so to speak, we focus on telling the story for all the world to hear. And we turn our attention to the meaning of Christmas so well summed up in Howard Thurman's poem, The Work of Christmas.

When the song of the angels is stilled,  
When the star in the sky is gone,  
When the kings and princes are home,  
When the shepherds are back with their flock,  
The work of Christmas begins:  
To find the lost, To heal the broken,  
To feed the hungry, To release the prisoner,  
To rebuild the nations,  
To bring peace among others,  
To make music in the heart.
