Dear Friends,

On January 26, we held our annual meeting. Many of you were in attendance as we worshiped together, shared a meal, and conducted the business of our congregation. For those who were not able to be in attendance, here are a few highlights of the year past:

- We begin 2020 with a much healthier financial position than what we showed when we began 2019. We ended 2018 with a budget shortfall of nearly \$49,000. We ended 2019 about \$7500 in the black. Thank you for your generous support of the ministries here at St. Mark's.
- Staffing adjustments that were made last year opened up many more opportunities for member involvement in the work of the congregation. You all stepped up. Thank you to committee members, morning receptionists, musicians and worship leaders, Children's Church and Confirmation leaders, hospitality leaders, and so many more. You have all made it work.
- In spite of a tight budget we were able to fix a whole bunch of things this past year. We replaced the Sanctuary roof, repaired or replaced over 100 steam traps, managed some much needed parking lot repairs, renovated some rooms, among other projects. Again, thank you for your commitment to the care of this property from which we are able to go and do God's work in the world.
- We were able to get the columbarium installed after many years of dreaming, planning and hard work. Several of our people have been laid to rest in this beautiful, peaceful, sacred space.
- This past year we opened our space to new partnerships with Genesis
 East and Head Start. These new relationships are proving to be incredibly
 mutually beneficial. Thank you for your hospitality and willingness to
 share our space.
- On top of everything else this past year, we were able to continue and in some instances, expand the ministries we have been engaged in together for years. We continued to care for our congregational members, our neighbors in North St. Paul, and our partners around the world in India, Tanzania, and now Rwanda. We worshipped together, learned together, prayed and played together.

It has been a good year. Thank you all for your partnership. It is a joy to work alongside you all. I am looking ahead to another good year. Our foundation is solid and provides us with a good opportunity to build.

The annual meeting also gave us the chance to look ahead as we move into 2020. We identified a few areas that need our attention and provide us with opportunities for growth in this next year:

to regular church attendance? Our community of North St. Paul offers us some great opportunities to reach out to new folks. North St. Paul offers good and affordable housing for young families and new family homes are under construction. Young couples with babies who are new to the North St. Paul community have been showing up in worship and in baptism classes. Let's not pass up these opportunities.

- We haven't had a strong stewardship emphasis for a long time. That's changing this coming year. St. Mark's will be participating in a program sponsored by the St. Paul Area Synod called Stewardship for All Seasons. A team from St. Mark's will work with a consultant and join with other congregations in the synod, to define our vision and values, and implement new ministry opportunities. You will be hearing more about this program in the very near future. I'm excited about it!
- We are paying attention to worship and will continue to do so in this coming year particularly the second service Sunday morning and the Wednesday evening service. I am so grateful for the quality of our music staff and the willingness of members to step up and give of their time and talents to lead us in worship. I don't think we're done sorting everything out yet after the changes to our worship this past year, but we will continue to pay attention to making our worship faithful, meaningful and joyful.

- Kelly Kleppe, Gary Hook, and Alan Wyman were thanked for their years of good service as treasurer and council members.
- Gary Hook announced a fund drive for a new Chapel roof. Estimated cost will be \$25,000 and it would be good to have a \$3000 cushion for unforeseen contingencies. Cost of materials will increase by the end of March, so it is important to move on this project as soon as possible. Gary has been making phone calls, and prior to the annual meeting, he had already collected pledges of \$13,000. He invited those in attendance to write a check toward this project now, to avoid a call from him in the near future! Many folks contributed to the cause and we anticipate having the money in hand before work begins this Spring. If you would like to make a contribution (before Gary calls you) you may make checks payable to St. Mark's. Please indicate Chapel roof on the memo line. Thanks much!
