Rachel's Day is Sunday May 8

The day takes its name from Jeremiah 31:15-17, in which the matriarch Rachel grieves for her children. Rachel's Day is a time to mourn the loss of our children and to renounce the forces of violence and fear. At the 1996 Women of the ELCA Triennial Convention, delegates passed a memorial on Rachel's Day. We continue to observe Rachel's Day in order to broaden awareness of the violence suffered by children and to encourage taking action to address it. The Women of St. Mark's will distribute blue ribbons as a symbol of support.

Relocation of the Grace Space

As parents of young children know, worshipping as a family can be a challenge. It's difficult for the smallest of God's children to sit still for the length of a service on the best of days, and nearly impossible on the worst. The Grace Space in our sanctuary is intended to provide young children with an engaging environment that gives parents an opportunity to focus on, and be mentally present in worship. It is a wonderful gift to young families but could use some improvement to better meet the needs of our worshiping community. In the near future we will be relocating the Grace Space from its current position in the front of the sanctuary to the rear, directly back from where it is currently located.

With the Grace Space in the rear of the sanctuary, young children will still be able to move around and play but in a less prominent area. This will help to minimize distraction for others and allow parents to make a quick and discreet exit if needed. As a parents of young children, Anna and I have appreciated the Grace Space and we look forward to the changes. It'll make life a little bit easier for all of us with littles in tow!

This project has received the full support of our Property Committee and Church Council. It has an estimated cost of \$5,000 to cover the cost of materials for the construction of a false floor to level out that area, construct a railing, and purchase furniture and other items appropriate to the space. The St. Mark's Foundation has graciously offered to cover up to \$2,500 of the costs. Pastor Mary, recognizing the renovated Grace Space is a positive investment in St. Mark's future, is inviting those who would like to make a gift in honor of her retirement to consider designating those gifts to the Grace Space project. Youth Education Volunteers Needed for 2022-23

As we enter into the finals weeks of Youth Education for 2021-22 we are already preparing for 2022-23 and are asking for the congregation's continue support to sustain and grow our Youth and Family ministry. *The preliminary calendar for 2022-23 is shown below.*

For 2022-23 we are looking for 8 adults to serve as teachers on Wednesday nights for PreK-6th Classes, and 4 Confirmation Adult Leaders. Specifically we would like a pair of co-teachers for each of the following grade levels: PreK & Kindergarten, 1st & 2nd grade, 3rd & 4th grade, and 5th & 6th grade. As well as a pair of co-leaders for 7th and 8th confirmation classes.

While the bulk of our Youth Education will be on Wednesdays we would also like to offer Sunday School for families who are interested. In order to do so, we are looking for a pair of volunteers to serve as Sunday School co-teachers. Initially there would be a single PreK-3rd Grade classroom for Sunday School on Sunday mornings.

We would also like to find someone to serve as a volunteer Youth Ed
Coordinator for PreK-6th grade. This person would be responsible for preparing classroom materials, tracking attendance, assisting classroom teachers, and working with Pastor David to ensure our teachers are supported and our students are engaged. This volunteer position would be about 3 hours per week.

Being able to share the faith with our young people is a great gift and a sacred task. If you've taught in the past and want to teach again we'd love to have you. If you've never taught before but have a heart for kids we'd love to have you.
