Dear Friends,

Christ is Risen! Last Sunday we celebrated the good news of the resurrection, revealed through an empty tomb 2000 years ago. As followers of Christ, we join the disciples in living our lives in the light of that reality.

At the Tuesday Morning Bible Study this week, we looked at Mark's account of the first Easter morning. Jenn Luong shared an insight that I think was brilliant. Look at the verses I have copied above. This is the scene that greets the women who have come to the tomb. They come expecting to find Jesus' body. Instead, a young man in white robes directs them elsewhere.

Jenn reflected that so often we think we know where we will find God, where we will find Jesus. We tend to think that God is to be found in our church buildings. After all, don't we call our church the House of God? But the message that the women receive is "He is not here. He is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him." The young man sends them out into the world, back to their fishing boats and homes and families, and tells them that Jesus will meet them there.

Especially now, when we can't gather together in "God's House", I think it's good to be reminded that God is not confined to our brick and mortar structures. In fact, the message of the empty tomb tells us that we are more apt to find Jesus waiting for us in the outside world and in our ordinary, everyday lives.

All of life, wherever we are, is lived out in the presence of God. Every step we take, wherever we go, is taken with Jesus as our companion. God is not limited to a particular building any more than Jesus was limited to a grave. During this time of social distancing, may you experience the love and presence of God as Jesus meets you wherever you are.

Watching services on your smart TV

If you have YouTube on your TV, you can access the services and watch on a bigger screen. Just open the YouTube app. Select "search" and then type in all the letters/numbers (not case sensitive) after the "/" from the video URL. For example, for yesterday's service you would type in: NLklczBvWQo. Disclaimer: While this seems to work on most smart TVs, it may not work on yours.

For example, if you use xfinity:

- 1. Press the xfinity button on your remote.
- 2. Select "apps"
- 3. Select YouTube
- 4. Select "search" (the little magnifying glass)
- 5. Type the number/letter combination after the "/" from the URL into the search box (not case sensitive). The video should appear at the bottom of the screen. Or search "Gary Martin st marks church nsp", then select the GM button to see all the uploaded videos.
- 6. Just click on a video to watch.

Electronic Giving

You can find the link at the bottom of the home page, or under the "About" tab. It's easy, secure, and provides for the support of St. Mark's ministries even when we can't be together. Once at the VANCO site, select "set up profile" and follow instructions.
