

# Weekly Update

April 2, 2020

#### Dear Friends,

This coming Sunday is Palm Sunday, the day that begins Holy Week, when we remember Jesus' last week on earth. I have always appreciated the observance of Holy Week and the sense that we are walking with Jesus through that last week in real time. I have some great church memories of children's pageants and palm branch processions. I have known congregations that actually brought in a real donkey for the day, though I think s/he was left at the front door. I have always looked forward to reliving the events of the week: sharing the bread and wine with Jesus and his other disciples in the upper room on Thursday, fighting sleep as he prays; hiding in the background and trying not to be noticed as he is brought before Pilate; taking my place at the foot of the cross with the others who watch in sorrow and disbelief as he takes his last agonized breath.

And then waiting. Waiting through the long weekend for the surprise we are always ready for, when we will go with the women, early in the morning, on the first day of the week, while it is still dark, to the open and empty tomb. This year it will be different. This year Holy Week will be lived out in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic. We will observe the events of Jesus' last week in relative isolation. All the things we have come to expect and enjoy, will not be available to us. The week will be quieter. The week will hold sadness, uncertainty, confusion, and fear.

I wonder if the emotions we are experiencing this year, though, aren't a little closer to the emotions that Jesus and the disciples experienced that first Holy Week. While the week started for them with the excitement and joy of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, things deteriorated fast. Before the week was up, cries of "Hosanna!" had turned to cries of "Crucify him!" Before the week was up, the one who had been hailed as Messiah and King, was arrested and executed. Imagine the confusion. What's going on? Imagine the grief. How could Jesus be dead? Imagine the fear. Am I next? Imagine the despair. Now what?

As we live through this pandemic together, we ask the same questions. What's going on? How could so many be dying? Am I next? Now what? I don't have the answers to those questions. The answers will come as we live into them. I imagine, though, that the answers will be similar to the answers the disciples received after that first Holy Week. The disciples learned that there were certain events and experiences in life that changed everything. The disciples learned that even when things did not go the way they wanted them to go, alternative outcomes could be even better than they had expected. The disciples learned that even in the midst of suffering, death and grief, God was at work to bring forth new life.

It's Almost Holy Week. Right now we have a road of isolation, struggle, fear, uncertainty to walk. Unfortunately we don't get to just jump ahead to Easter and have this all behind us. It won't be that quick or easy. But we do get to walk this journey holding on to the promise of the empty tomb, and that colors and informs how we journey. At the end of this, we will realize that this is one of those events and experiences that changes everything. At the end of this we will discover positive outcomes we couldn't have anticipated. At the end of this, we will experience the new life that God is always breathing into the world.
