Payroll Protection Plan Update

Two weeks ago we informed you that the council and finance committee had voted to apply for a Payroll Protection Plan loan. As a reminder, this PPP loan is a government support program intended to assist small businesses and non-profit organizations (like churches) during this time of economic uncertainty brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic.

As part of the economic response to the COVID-19 crisis, Congress passed and President Trump signed into law the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The primary financial aid offered under this Act that is applicable to churches is the Paycheck Protection Program. This program authorizes up to \$349 billion in forgivable loans to organizations to pay their employees during the ongoing pandemic.

Our loan application was granted and we have received sufficient funds to cover payroll expenses and some utilities for the next 8 weeks. The full amount of the loan is forgivable if it is used for these purposes, paid out within the 8 week time frame, and no one is laid off. We are grateful for our government's foresight in recognizing the value of the faith community, and for the ongoing strong support of the folks of St. Mark's, who continue to contribute to the ministry and mission of our congregation.

Watching services on your smart TV

If you have YouTube on your TV, you can access the services and watch on a bigger screen. Note: we have changed the name of the YouTube channel to **St. Mark's Lutheran Church NSP**.

For example, if you use xfinity:

- 1. Press the xfinity button on your remote.
- Select "apps"
- 3. Select YouTube
- Select "search" (the little magnifying glass)
- Type the number/letter combination after the "/"
 from the video URL into the search box (not case
 sensitive). The video should appear at the bottom of
 the screen.
 - Or search **St. Mark's Lutheran Church NSP**, then select the button to see all the uploaded videos and subscribe to the channel. *Side note: who knew there were so many St. Mark's out there?!*
- 6. Just click on a video to watch.
