# New! Update regarding Worship Service and Annual Meeting of the Congregation Sunday, January 30

On the recommendation of the Restoration Team, St. Mark's has shifted the annual meeting to a **completely virtual format.** The schedule for day will be as follows:

- 9:30 am: ONE combined in-person worship service
- 12:00 pm: Annual Meeting held virtually via Zoom

Everyone is encouraged to attend. Even online, we need a quorum of 100 people to vote on the budget, so it is especially important for members to attend. Prior to the meeting, St. Mark's will email the Zoom link, technical support number, and a digital copy of the annual report.

# **Update on Afghan Family**

We finally met our family this past Friday evening! With the help of our excellent translator, Khoshal, we were able to meet and learn a bit about their history and their needs. We sat, most of us on the floor, as is their tradition, and were served sweet tea and a selection of interesting and tasty Afghan cookies and candies. The father, Hamidullah, worked in Afghanistan as a driver for an NGO and as an auto mechanic. They do not have any family here, but the father said that there is one other person he knows living in MN. It sounds like they were sent here (like being sent to Siberia!). We apologized for the lack of weather hospitality, but the family seems to be getting off on a good foot. They have received EBT cards that allow them to purchase groceries and have found stores within walking distance. They have also been using the train, which runs along University Ave and is just 1 block away.

The family seems to be loving and affectionate, with good emotional dynamics, as far as I could tell. We were able to meet the mother and two older sons, who are around 20 years old. One of them has some computer experience and certification. Whether that is helpful or useful in the US remains to be seen. The two daughters are of school age but have not yet enrolled. The family needs some help in this area, as their English skills are minimal. The children have some basic language skills, more than the parents, so we may be relying on them for translating help as we work with them arranging appointments. The other area of urgent need is healthcare. Both of the parents said that they have dental issues that need addressing, which we have begun working on.

Hamidullah said that he is very grateful for the work that we have done in setting up their household. He added that it was better than he could have done himself, and more than they had hoped for.

Thank you to everybody at St. Mark's for all your generosity in helping out this family. Please remember to keep our Mentor Team and this family in your prayers as we begin our work together. Please also pray for our translator, Khoshal, who has many family members left behind in Afghanistan and who may not be safe due to their work for the government that preceded the Taliban's return to power.
