St. Mark's Restoration Team - Planning for Reopening the Church

"I will restore you to health and heal your wounds, declares the Lord." (Jeremiah 30:17)

The promise of restoration is a repeated theme throughout the Bible, offering hope when all else seems to contradict it. Throughout our history Christians have looked to the physical Church as a gathering place for us to come together, worship together, mourn together, praise together and pray together. In the current circumstances where Covid-19 has physically kept us apart - we are still St. Mark's NSP in Spirit and in Community. Staying connected via the weekly on-line services has been a welcome alternative and we are very thankful for the efforts of our pastors, staff and parishioners who have worked hard in bringing the message of Christ into our homes. The big question on everyone's minds is "When will the Church reopen and we can once again worship together?" Seems like a simple inquiry but there is not an easy response. There are many things to consider in ensuring that we can reopen safely and that all precautions are in place to protect any and all who enter our building. Jesus came to save, to bless, to redeem and to protect. As disciples of Christ we are called to protect one another both spiritually and physically.

Towards that goal, the St. Mark's Restoration Team has been formed to look closely into the various guidelines, process steps, timelines and action steps that will be required in order to bring about a phased reopening of our Church - for Worship, for Gatherings, for use by Partner Organizations and most importantly for the Fellowship that our physical space offers. The team has now met twice via Zoom meetings and is in the process of gathering information to help make sound decisions.

This process will take some time as we build the action plan for St. Mark's to reopen it's doors. We will follow the directives of the St. Paul Area Synod of the ELCA, the guidance of State and Local governments, the initiatives of the CDC and the best from our neighbors in Christ who are also facing the difficult task of reopening their own Churches. So when will St. Mark's reopen? Right now we do not have that specific date in place. We are hopeful to have our plan to the Church Council close to September 1 and look to have a date in that proposal. Until then we will continue with our on-line worship and communications through the Weekly Update.

There is no doubt that conducting Church will be different - there will be masks, there will be social distancing, there will be extra cleaning and sanitation, there will be restrictions for building access and flow. We all will play a part in ensuring the safety and protection of one another - know that these things will be conducted in a phased approach and we will adjust on an ongoing basis through 2020.

Thank you, St. Mark's community for the patience and support of the Restoration Team's efforts.
