"As many of you may already have heard, on Tuesday morning about 4:30, my mother, Carol, experienced a massive brain bleed. She was taken by ambulance to United hospital where a CAT scan showed there was nothing that could be done other than to keep her comfortable. That afternoon we were able to bring her home with Hospice care. She has a bed in the sunroom and all of her kids and grandkids have been able to be here with her.

She remains unresponsive but comfortable. My father, Wayne, is able to sit next to her in his favorite chair and hold her hand and tell stories about her life and their love. It is sacred time as we wait in hope for her death. We are grateful for family and a faith that assures us that death is not the end of the story."

Please keep their family in your prayers. Pastor Mary will be continuing her time off next week as well (July 13-16).
