Thank you for showing up on Sunday mornings, Wednesday evenings, and throughout the week, in person and on-line, ready to worship, to learn, to pitch in wherever needed, to laugh, to cry, to sing and pray. This is God's gift of community at its best.

Last but certainly not least, thank you to a wonderful staff. It has been an honor to work alongside of you. Your competence, care for this congregation and each other, is an inspiration. Each of you goes above and beyond the basic duties of your job to ensure that things run smoothly and people feel cared for and appreciated. Each of you understands that what you do is a ministry – work done to the glory of God. Thank you.

This coming Sunday will be a bittersweet day for me. I look forward to it and I dread it! Together we will mark an ending and give thanks for the time we have been blessed to share together. And then we will each begin something new, trusting that God is making a way and blessing our paths.

Parking Lot Replacement Coming in June

It's no secret that our parking lots have seen better days. While a lot of hours have been put into patching holes and keeping the lot usable, the time has come to start fresh.

Replacing the lot is a big and costly undertaking but there's never been a better time to get it done. Having made its way through the Property and Finance Committees, a plan to replace the parking lot was approved by the Church Council at its April meeting. The cost of this project, which includes both upper and lower parking lots, and some curb and sidewalk work, is \$145,000. The Council voted to take out a 15 year loan with the Mission Investment Fund (MIF), a ministry of the ELCA, to finance this project.

While the financing of this project will be done through the MIF loan, the repayment costs will largely be covered by revenue generated from our parking lot use agreement with North High School. It is the confident hope of the Church Council that with your financial support, in addition to the parking lot use revenue, we will be able to pay this loan off ahead of schedule. A designated fund has been created for Parking Lot Repair and Maintenance. Please consider setting up a recurring monthly donation in support of this fund in any amount by visiting our online giving portal (www.stmarks-nsp.org). You may also place a check in the offering plate on Sunday mornings or mail your contribution to the church office.

Our parking lot is an important asset and it is vital that we care for it. The parking lot is one of the first things people see when they come to St. Mark's and it is the path they take to our front door. Having a brand new lot will be like rolling out the red carpet for guests and members alike. It says, "Welcome. We are glad you are here and you are important to us!"

An Opportunity to Help a Child in Kihesa

Greetings from Kihesa Lutheran Church, our sister congregation in Iringa, Tanzania. Brayan Mwilonga, age 15, needs our help. Brayan is the fourth of eight children. His family is a member of Kihesa and he was confirmed there. He has been sick for many years, but doctors have finally been able to diagnose his problems as failed kidneys. His parents sold many things in the house and property to provide medical help and dialysis. In a poor country, like Tanzania, they have now become one of the very poor. Unfortunately, Brayan's father has abandoned the family, leaving his mother to deal with everything. Relatives and neighbors have helped, but it is not enough. Brayan will need a kidney transplant; his mother is a candidate. Brayan has missed much schooling due to his illness. Currently he is in standard 7 (seventh grade) with his younger sister.

Afghan Family Update

Our friends from Afghanistan, the Safi family, are continuing to do well in no small part due to the generous work, prayer, and financial support of the St. Mark's community. Hamid, the father, is the only one working at the present time as Mom has her hands full caring for a family of seven and the five children are hard at work with school. His work as a "cart-pusher" at Walmart will end soon as he has found a spot at Pearson Candy in St. Paul which is much closer to home.

In the past 10 days Hamid got his driver's permit AND passed the road test, so he is a licensed MN driver! I rode with him to the test site, and even though his English isn't the best (he struggled with instructions for left vs. right as we practiced ahead of time) he is a very good and careful driver, which is not surprising as his last job in Afghanistan involved transporting high-level political figures. He spent an hour and a half behind the wheel of a 5 speed and didn't kill the engine once. Pretty good considering he hadn't driven in 9 months! This is great news for the family who will now be on the hunt for a car. Hamid has worked as a mechanic most of his life, so please keep your eyes open for a fixer-upper!

Please continue to keep the Safi family in your prayers as they continue moving forward in their adventure as new Americans.

Youth Education Volunteers Needed for 2022-23

As we enter into the finals weeks of Youth Education for 2021-22 we are already preparing for 2022-23 and are asking for the congregation's continue support to sustain and grow our Youth and Family ministry. *The preliminary calendar for 2022-23 is shown below.*

For 2022-23 we are looking for 8 adults to serve as teachers on Wednesday nights for PreK-6th Classes, and 4 Confirmation Adult Leaders. Specifically we would like a pair of co-teachers for each of the following grade levels: PreK & Kindergarten, 1st & 2nd grade, 3rd & 4th grade, and 5th & 6th grade. As well as a pair of co-leaders for 7th and 8th confirmation classes.

While the bulk of our Youth Education will be on Wednesdays we would also like to offer Sunday School for families who are interested. In order to do so, we are looking for a pair of volunteers to serve as Sunday School co-teachers. Initially there would be a single PreK-3rd Grade classroom for Sunday School on Sunday mornings.

We would also like to find someone to serve as a volunteer Youth Ed Coordinator for PreK-6th grade. This person would be responsible for preparing classroom materials, tracking attendance, assisting classroom teachers, and working with Pastor

David to ensure our teachers are supported and our students are engaged. This volunteer position would be about 3 hours per week.

Being able to share the faith with our young people is a great gift and a sacred task. If you've taught in the past and want to teach again we'd love to have you. If you've never taught before but have a heart for kids we'd love to have you.
