Members needed to serve on Call Committee

The Nominating Committee is looking for members of the congregation to serve on a Call Committee. This Call Committee will be tasked with identifying candidates for our pastoral staff. We are looking for 8-10 people to serve on this committee. The Church Council would like a Call Committee to be established within the next month and hopes these positions will be filled quickly.

The Call Committee's primary objective will be to identify candidates for the lead pastor position. Our current associate pastor, Pastor David Bjorklund, has indicated he is willing to be considered for the lead pastor role. As internal candidate, Pastor David would initially be the only candidate for consideration.

Should the Call Committee put Pastor David's name forward, there would be special congregational meeting to vote on Pastor David for lead pastor. Should the congregation choose not select Pastor David for the lead pastor role, the committee would then move on to consider other candidates for the position. If the congregation were to choose Pastor David as lead pastor, then the Call Committee would transition to identifying candidates for the associate pastor position.

Our partners at the St. Paul Area Synod have been working with the Council during this time of transition and will continue to offer guidance throughout this process. Opportunity to participate in The Nourishing Vocation Project

Vocation comes from the Latin word *vocare* which means "to call." Hence, vocation literally means "calling." To embrace vocation is to recognize that what one does in life is not merely by one's personal choice or for one's personal fulfillment or gain. Instead, God daily calls people to be a part of God's purposes in this world for the sake of the common good. Leaning into the call of God is to live attentive to vocation.

St. Mark's has been invited to participate in *The Nourishing Vocation Project* (NVP) through St. Olaf College. The NVP invites individual participants and whole congregations to deepen their understanding of God's call upon their life and work so that they might live life on purpose and engage in ministry on purpose for the common good.

Pastor David is looking for 5-6 individuals to participate as Congregational Vocation Ministers (CVM). This team of CVMs will work first to nourish vocation in their lives and later be invited to lead the congregation in the same *work*. As part of this project, **St. Olaf has offered to pay for 3 of our CVMs to attend the Conference on Worship, Theology and Arts at St. Olaf, July 25th-28th.** This opportunity could not come as a better time in the life of St. Mark's. As we enter a new chapter in the life of our congregation now is a great time to explore and nourish our individual and shared sense of vocation. Council Corner – May 19 meeting

St. Mark's gave Pastor Mary Froiland a well-deserved celebratory farewell event on Sunday, May 15 for her retirement. Her last message to us was to cherish the past, but rejoice in things anew! Your Council will take that message to heart. The following was discussed at the last Council meeting:

- Pr. David reported that the Global Barnyard drive was a huge success. In addition, planning for this summer's VBS and next year's youth program is underway, and he is seeking volunteers to serve where needed with their talents.
- The Finance reported the General cash balance at \$185,000, with an uptick in giving in April from this time last year.
- Because of the anticipated parking lot restoration in June, the Property Committee has moved forward with the project to remove several trees on the property due to disease or damage. The HVAC and Grace Space projects are also moving ahead.
- The Restoration team is strongly suggesting using masks for indoor gatherings.
