Dear friends,

1 Samuel chapter 8 details Israel's demand for a king. It's a pivotal point in Israel's story as it marks a rejection of God's sovereignty over them. God instructs the prophet Samuel to warn the people of consequences of choosing an earthly king over the kingship of God but the people will not be swayed. They persist in their demands and Saul is appointed king. Long story short, it did not go well. The failures and infidelities of Israel's kings are well documented in scripture (see 1 and 2 Kings, and 1 and 2 Chronicles).

This Sunday is **Christ the King Sunday**. On this final day of the church year we are reminded that Christ the King is unlike the kings and rulers of this world. This year for Christ the King we are offering a unique service that walks us through the whole liturgical calendar. The service begins with Advent and ends with Christ the King. In between we will celebrate Christmas and Epiphany, Lent and Easter, the Day of Pentecost and the season of Pentecost. It's a fantastic service and I'm excited that we get to share it with you.

So join us this Sunday as we celebrate the liberating reign of Christ the King. Don't forget that Sunday also marks the end of our fall stewardship campaign. Remember to bring your intent cards and be sure to stick around after service for delicious soup in Rees Hall.

Call Committee Update

The Call Committee is moving into the interviewing phase of the call process. Here is information provided by the Church Council in Weekly Updates earlier this year.

The Call Committee's primary objective is to identify candidates for the lead pastor position. Our current associate pastor, Pastor David Bjorklund, has indicated he is willing to be considered for the lead pastor role. As an internal candidate, Pastor David would initially be the only candidate for consideration.

Should the Call Committee put Pastor David's name forward, there would be a special congregational meeting to vote on Pastor David for lead pastor. Should the congregation choose not to select Pastor David for the lead pastor role, the committee would then move on to consider other candidates for the position. If the congregation were to choose Pastor David as lead pastor, then the Call Committee will transition to identifying candidates for the associate pastor position.

Our partners at the St. Paul Area Synod have been working with the Council and with the Call Committee during this time of transition and will continue to offer guidance throughout this process.
