#### **Council Corner - November 17 meeting**

Council met in November to discuss the following:

- Council had several committees come to the meeting to discuss items, such as enhancements to sanctuary service projection and building security, as well as upcoming budget needs, and Call committee's recommendation process.
- CYF had successful events with Feed My Starving Children and Moonlight Madness.
- The Finance committee reported expenditures under budgeted forecast by \$70,000 and the General Fund cash balance just over \$200,000. The audit review is close to being completed once Finance resolves a few minor inquiries.
- Hospitality is seeking all new and experienced bakers to bring in Christmas cookies for our upcoming special congregational meeting on Dec. 11, which is set to review and vote on the recommended updates to St. Mark's constitution.
- The Music Ministry, led by Pr. Arne Bergland, will begin the process to assess St. Mark's wants/needs for the upcoming year.
- The Nominating committee is seeking interested members of St. Mark's to join Council. Please reach out if this is where you see your gifts and talents fit.
- Players and Planners committee is seeking participation from St. Mark's. Please reach out to Tyler Ronsberg if interested in reviving our historically successful drama program.
- Stewardship Sunday was last week, and Council would like to thank all committee members for their hard work and effort leading this drive to bring our collective service to one another, both inside St. Mark's walls and also to our larger community.
- In preparation for the Dec. 11 congregational meeting, both Council and Constitutional Review committee members will be available in the Fireside room after Nov. 27 and Dec. 4 services to discuss any questions.


