

Weekly Update

Dear Friends,

It's been a long time since we have had the opportunity to be together in person, so I am very excited about plans for an upcoming worship service. On Sunday, September 13, at 10:00 am, we will be gathering in our parking lot for an outdoor service. Participants may bring their own lawn chairs or stay in their cars. The service will be broadcast through an FM transmitter, so you will be able to tune your car radios to hear it. Everyone will be asked to wear masks and maintain appropriate physical distancing. We are hoping for good weather so we can pull this off!

This will also be God's Work, Our Hands (GWOH) Sunday, an ELCA event that St. Mark's has participated in for years. On this particular Sunday each year, congregations around the country reach out in service to their neighbors and communities. The question this year is how to reach out when we are unable to touch. Well, we have come up with a few options.

Option 1: Burdock removal at Southwood Park

Jim Wolf has set up this opportunity for us. People will want to wear closed toe shoes, long pants and may also want to wear long sleeves. Bring bug protection. This is an activity that fleece wear is not good to wear because of the seeds. People would be walking into and through areas of the preserve (woods primarily, but some burdock will be found in prairie areas). We need to have a count of volunteers ahead of time so enough equipment can be gathered, so please let Jim or Pastor Mary know if your hands will be a part of this project.

Option 2: Grounds work at St. Mark's

There will be outside projects for us to work on around the church grounds and gardens. Bring gloves and tools as you are able.

Option 3: Tying fleece blankets for baptisms at St. Mark's

This is a project the youth will be completing – with good social distancing. Women of the church have purchased fleece and cut it in preparation for tying. Blankets are then presented at baptisms.

Option 4: Non-Perishable Food Collection for NSP Food Shelf

This is a GWOH project that everyone may participate in! Needs are higher than ever in our community and this is a simple way to help our neighbors. We will have tables in the parking lot for folks to leave food donations, which will then be taken to the food shelf.

There may be other options. If you have an idea for a project that could be accomplished safely, please let me know. **Don't forget to wear your bright yellow GWOH T-shirts!**

I look forward to seeing you in person, even if only from a distance.
