Music Notes

Tom Paulson, Director of Music & Worship

Many years ago I worked with an intern who made a really good point in her sermon. It seems like, throughout history, that whenever two Christians disagreed with each other, one went off and started a new church. That is us! Martin Luther disagreed with the Catholic Church, and his followers became known as Protestants or Lutherans. At the same time Henry VIII feuded with the pope, and declared himself head of the church in England, the Anglican or Episcopalian church. Methodists, Baptists, Puritans, Unitarians, Congregationalists, Quakers, all disagreed with another church, and formed their own. I don't think that all this division is what God had in mind.

Our scripture today teaches us about living among God's faithful people, all of them, not just those who agree with you. Our music reflects that. We begin by singing "gather in the lost and forsaken, the blind and the lame, the rich and the haughty, the proud and the strong, nourish us and teach us to fashion holy lives and true hearts (ELW 532)." After Pastor David's sermon, we'll sing a paraphrase of Psalm 133, "Oh how good it is when the family of God dwells together in spirit, in faith and unity." The poets remind us that life is a journey to be shared, and together we rejoice, weep, find strength, grace, and belonging. And we'll close with a song that may well become our Baptismal theme song, and expounding on the life-as-a-journey theme, I'm Going on a Journey. Note the poignant, especially relevant third verse.:

There are other saints who have said amen.
They'll keep me faithful to my journey's end.
Along the way I want to be
the kind of person that God set free. (ELW 446)
