Music Notes

Today in worship we are beginning the St. Mark's Christmas festivities. Jesus, coming into the world, being born among us and in us, is so central to our faith and important to our being that we celebrate in a big way – Sundays, December 14, 21 and 28, Christmas Eve at 3 &10pm, Christmas Day at 9:30am, and it all comes together when we sing, "Go, Tell it on the Mountain. Jesus Christ is Born!" on Sunday, January 4.

We begin with a Christmas Program, sort of. You've heard the birth of Jesus called the Greatest Story Ever Told. Well, our adaptation is the Greatest Story Ever Told (Well, Almost). As our narrator tells the story, our characters will gather around the manger. This is an opportunity for everyone to participate. If you've ever wanted to be an angel, a shepherd, a barn animal, here's your chance. See the costumer out in the narthex before worship and she will get you set. (Or just come forward, no costume necessary). The narrator will call you up. We cast Mary, Joseph, Jesus and the donkey ahead of time, but if you'd like to be one of them, I see no reason we can't have two Mary's!

This all begs the question for you to ponder this Christmas. Who are you in this story? Are you Mary carrying, waiting, expecting, and giving birth? Are you Joseph, feeling responsible for this new, homeless family? Are you the innkeeper, opening your heart, your mind and your home? Are you an angel celebrating the birth, or a shepherd going and telling everybody? Whoever you are, know that there is room for you in God's abundant and abiding love.

Apropos of nothing, did you know that the distance from Nazareth in Galilee to Bethlehem in Judea, is roughly the same as from Owatonna in Steele County to North St. Paul in Ramsey County?

Men's Book Study Group

If you are interested in reading Scott Galloway's Notes on Being a Man as part of a men's book study in January please contact Pastor David (prdavidb@stmarks-nsp.org). Here's a brief description from the book jacket: "Boys and Men are in Crisis. Rarely has a cohort fallen further and faster than young men living in Western democracies. Boys are less likely to graduate from high school or college than girls. One in seven men report having to friends, and men account for three of every four deaths of despair in America. Even worse, the lack of attention to these problems has created a vacuum filled by voices espousing misogyny, the demonization of others, and a toxic vision of masculinity. But this just isn't a male issue: Women and children can't flourish if men aren't doing well. As we know from spares of violence, there is nothing more dangerous than a lonely, broken young man. Scott Galloway has been sounding the alarm on this issue for years. In Notes on Being a Man, Galloway explores what it means to be a man in modern America."

Global Mission Craft Fair Report

Last Saturday, St. Mark's held a Craft Fair to benefit our Tanzania Mission. Thirty vendors participated including many St. Mark's members. We raised \$2,271, which was \$465 higher than last year. The funds will be donated to the Kihesa and Mtwivila congregations in Tanzania to help with their building projects.
