Virtual Awards & Scholarship Ceremony (Wednesday, June 10th at 6:30pm).

Our annual Awards and Scholarship night will be held virtually this year. Our staff will present awards and scholarships to students in all grades. We have been hard at work planning a fun and entertaining show, so please stay tuned on how to watch!

Senior Gift Deliveries (Thursday, June 11th and Friday, June 12th)

Our staff misses our students so much that they want to help deliver a personalized yard signs and a special gift to each of our seniors by driving to their homes. Drive-Up Processional (Monday, June 15th and Tuesday, June 16th)

All graduates will be invited to "have their moment" in cap-and-gown on stage so that each family can celebrate this incredible accomplishment! Each graduate will be assigned a time slot to come to Enfield High School in a vehicle. Once notified by a staff member, graduates will be allowed to exit their vehicle and walk across a stage to receive their diploma cover as their name is read aloud. Graduates will be permitted one vehicle per family, and family members (while remaining in their vehicles) will be permitted to cheer on each graduate as they walk across the stage. A photographer will take a professional-grade photograph of each graduate. We will provide a 5x7 and an electronic copy to each family in the weeks following the event. Following the moment on stage, each graduate will then pick up prizes from Safe Grad and then return to their vehicle. Additional Information.

Please note the following so that there are no surprises:

I was waiting to announce the dates of the drive-up procession because I was hoping to have a more definitive estimate of when diplomas would be delivered. While the diplomas are scheduled to be delivered by June 10th, the company could not guarantee a shipment date. Because of the impact of Covid-19, many manufacturers are behind in their shipments. So, there is a chance that the diplomas will not arrive in time for the drive-up procession. Even if that is the case, we will still hold the drive-up procession on the scheduled dates so that every graduate can celebrate their special moment on stage. We have some graduates leaving for the military and college in July, so we cannot delay our June celebration. As a back-up plan, we have about 50 diploma covers that can be sterilized and used for each graduate for the photo opportunity and family celebration.

Yearbooks.

Our yearbooks have also been delayed due to the impact of Covid-19. While we hope to be able to distribute these at the drive-up procession, there is also a chance, yearbooks will not be available until later in the summer. Despite our repeated efforts, these manufacturers have not been able to guarantee a specific date.
