Letter from Principal Clark

Enfield High School students and families,

I hope this letter finds you well. With so much up in the air, I know our students and families have been anxiously awaiting updates on school in the fall. The administrative team has been hard at work all summer planning for a variety of scenarios including in-person learning, remote learning, and a hybrid model. All our plans were informed by the guidance issued by the state of CT. We recently released a 30-plus page detailed reopening plan which can be viewed on our website. On our website you can also view video tutorials and recordings of live informational sessions.

In response to the district's decision to move to a hybrid model, our plans introduce new safety measures for our students and staff. For the hybrid plan, we have made significant adjustments

to reduce the chance of transmission by promoting social-distancing, mask wearing, and other important safety measures. While cohorting is challenging at the secondary level, we were able to reduce the number of class transitions by adjusting our school calendar. Students will now attend only 4 classes at a time (instead of 8), while still being able to earn the same number of credits in a school year. Additionally, we are adopting a number of procedures to help reduce transmission such as the addition of hand sanitizing stations in classrooms and one-way hallways

where feasible.

While we were thrust into remote learning last spring without warning, we now have had time to survey students, staff, and families and reflect on our experiences. Whether we are in-person, remote, or in the hybrid plan, we are committed to offering our students a high-quality education. We are adopting several improvement measures including a simplified schedule to help students stay organized, regular access to live instruction with the classroom teacher, and improved training for staff on distance learning technology. If we are forced to move to a remote learning model at any point, students will be required to attend live "synchronous" learning sessions with their teachers at designated times each day. Teachers will help students stay organized by providing a weekly email specifying learning tasks and assignment due dates. We are working with our curriculum coordinators to promote teaching and learning that is engaging, meaningful, and student-centered in the remote environment.

We also recognize that the disruption caused by this pandemic has taken a toll on many of our students' social and emotional well-being. In addition to providing targeted supports for those in need, we also

What are expectations for remote students?


Students learning from home should log into Microsoft Teams at the start of class each day as teachers will take attendance. Note that class times are different on Wednesday since the entire school will be remote on that day. Teachers facilitating instruction for in-person classes on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays will livestream their classes for students at home. Teachers may differentiate some portions of class as needed. Some lessons may require live-streaming for the entire period whereas

others may only livestream for a portion of the class. For example if a science teacher is running a handson lab in class, students at home may be asked to work on a virtual lab addressing the same skills remotely.

One possible example of a hypothetical class may look like this:

Remote students view livestream of in-person classes for first 20 minutes as teacher takes attendance, provides clear instructions on the day's

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learning goals and tasks, and performs any necessary modeling. The teacher then asks students in-class to work on one task and students at home to work on the same (or a different task). Students at home may stay online or log out for 30-40 minutes to complete asynchronous work. The teacher reminds all remote students to log back in for the last 20-30 minutes of class to assess progress and check for understanding. Remote students return to class for the last 20-30 minutes to share out on progress and to allow the teacher to check for student understanding.


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Student Schedules
