
Teacher Meet & Greet on Thursday, September 3rd from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m.

iPad Distribution Schedule

All students will be getting an iPad and keyboard case to be brought back and forth between home and school. The charger can be kept at home. Students will be using this device to complete assignments and access lessons as well as other learning resources. We will be distributing iPads next week. To make the process run more smoothly, please try to arrive at your assigned time (see below). If you are unable to make your assigned time, please come during last call or call the main office for other arrangements.

- We will be using this as a time to return iPads, cases, and chargers that were loaned in the Spring.
- We ask that you complete and bring the EPS iPad usage agreement with you. <u>Click here</u>
 <u>for iPad Usage Agreement</u> If you are unable to print at home, there will be extra copies
 here for you.

Where to go:

Please pull into the circle in front of the building by our main entrance. Pull up to the curb and stay in your car. A staff member will be available to assist you.

When to go:

Thursday, September 3rd

- Hybrid learning students with last names beginning with A-K (9:00am- 11:00am)
- Hybrid learning students with last names beginning with L-Z (1:00- 3:00)

*** Masks will be provided to hybrid students at this time. All workbooks and necessary

supplies will be provided to hybrid students when they attend school in person.

Friday, September 4th

- Students who are distance learning 5 days per week (9:00am- 11:00am) ***These students will receive materials needed for full distance learning.
- Last call, any remaining students (1:00- 3:00)

School Procedures

Safety

- **Social Distancing**: Staff and students will maintain 6 ft social distancing when feasible and will maximize social distancing if 6 ft is not possible
- Masks: <u>Staff and students are required to properly wear masks</u> when on the school bus and in the building.
 - Masks will not be worn during lunch and classroom teachers will provide hourly mask breaks throughout the day.

*** You will receive details for your child's at home learning days from the classroom teacher prior to the first day of school. ***

Students will remain with their teacher and class for the majority of the day. Times that students will be leaving the room include, but are not limited to: lunch, physical education, outdoor instruction, mask breaks, etc.

- **Specials**: The specials teachers will push into classrooms to provide instruction. Staff who travel between instructional spaces will follow appropriate hygiene procedures prior to transition to a different location within the building. Physical education classes may occur within the gym and/or outdoors (weather permitting).
- Water Bottles / Fountains: Students should bring a personal water bottle to school each
 day (no glass). School water fountains will be closed. Students will have access to
 classroom water faucets.

- Hallways / Traffic Patterns: There will be designated patterns for directional foot-traffic within corridors through clearly labeled markings on the floors to minimize face-to-face contact of students.
- Lunch plan: Students will have lunch in the classroom or outside. Lunch will be available if you choose to have school lunch (menu on the EPS website). You may use the MySchoolBucks program to limit cash transactions. With MySchoolBucks, you can add money to your account, view account balances and recent purchases, and set up notifications for upcoming payments from the convenience of your home, office, or onthe-go with the mobile app. Go to https://www.myschoolbucks.com for more information.
- Recess: Each class cohort will be assigned a designated area and time for recess.
 Students will wash their hands or use hand sanitizer before and after recess. Outdoor toys used at recess will only be shared within cohorts and will be disinfected regularly.
- **Visitors to the building**: Visitors are not permitted in the building unless it is an emergency and there has been prior approval by an administrator.
- Bus Safety:
 - Students in grades K-5 will be assigned seats.
 - · Siblings can sit together.
 - Students cannot change seats once they have been seated.
 - Arrive at the school AM Riders will disembark from the front of the bus to the back and should not touch any seats while getting off of the bus.
 - Bus Drivers will disinfect the bus before the afternoon pickup.
 - On Wednesdays, buses will be all thoroughly disinfected.

Things to know before the first day:

- School will start at 8:40 a.m. and students may get to school any time **AFTER 8:25 a.m.**There will be many teachers on duty the first day to help students find their room.
- If students are being driven in a car before school, they can be dropped off on the curb, by
 the glass vestibule near the gymnasium <u>after 8:25 a.m.</u>. If students arrive to school before
 8:25 a.m., their family must wait with them in the car until the doors open. This is very
 important to do because staff are not on bus duty until this time.
- School Hours


8:40 AM – 3:06 PM (Pickups will begin dismissing at 2:45pm to minimize dismissal traffic) Doors Open: 8:25 AM (Please do not arrive before this time)

• Student Pick-Up:

Pickups will begin dismissing at 2:45pm to minimize traffic during dismissal time. If students get picked up from school, their teacher will release them to their guardian directly from the classroom's exterior back door. All guardians must park their car, <u>bring their ID</u>, and come up to the exterior classroom door to pick up their child. Refer to attached map for classroom locations. For safety, there is <u>no curbside pick-up at dismissal</u>. **No unescorted students should**

be in the parking lot for any reason. Please do not congregate on school grounds during this time.

- When students arrive, they will go right into their classroom to start the day and begin learning all about important routines.
- Students will have a working snack time. Please remember to have them bring a snack each day.
- We will give students a supply pouch with everything they will need and it will be kept in school.
- Each student will be getting an iPad to be brought back and forth between home and school. The iPad will include an attached keyboard case. More information to come on iPad distribution.
