1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by President Chris Allee.

2. INVITED GUESTS

3. ELECTION / SEATING OF BOARD

4. MINUTES & REPORTS RECEIVED AND FILED

Mike Volkart moved to approve the meeting minutes from the September 9, 2024 Board Meeting as submitted. There was no Board Meeting held in October 2024. This motion was seconded by Jeff Koerkenmeier and unanimously approved by the Board.

Director Kevin Wieberg, presented the Treasurer's Report for October 2024 as follows:

Cheri Dix moved to approve the Accounts Payable and Payroll Reports as submitted. This motion was seconded by Ruthie Adams and unanimously approved by the Board.

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6. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Director Wieberg presented use of Eagle View Connect (software for viewing oblique flyover imagery) to the Board in reference to the previously discussed Moniteau County Assessor's request for funding of Oblique Imagery. Moniteau County Assessor Marcy Oerly requested assistance with funding an imagery flyover in 2025. The total cost of the project is \$55,405, the last flyover was performed in 2022 in which Moniteau County Emergency Dispatch contributed \$6,500 towards. Other entities which contribute funding towards the project include City of California (\$5,000), City of Tipton (\$5,000), CoMo Electric (\$3,000). The Moniteau County Assessor's Office is requesting "a slight increase" to our previous contribution as the cost of the project has increased.

Director Wieberg presented a report from Eagle view from January 1, 2023 through November 4, 2024 which revealed MCED logged in to the software 178 times over a 673 day period which was 14% of the total, 10% of all Image views and 3% of searches during this time period. Director Wieberg also polled the dispatch staff who state they do not routinely utilize this software.

The overall consensus of the Board was there is no large benefit to 911 with new imagery compared to the imagery that is 3 years old and would be more inclined to contribute for the next flyover.

Chri dix moved to decline funding this project for 2025, this motion was seconded by Jeff Koerkenmeier and unanimously agreed by the Board.

7. NEW BUSINESS

Director Wieberg recommended to take \$100,000 from checking and move to a CD and allocate to Building Construction. This was agreed by upon by the Board and Director Wieberg will poll local banks for best rates.

Director Wieberg presented a draft of the 2025 Operating Budget. Discussion followed, no action was taken.

Director Wieberg gave a presentation on procurement of property for a new 911 center. Director Wieberg presented options to remain at the same location, or purchase one fo the following property: behind Sheriff's Office on Windmill ridge, E Buchannan St, Cedar St or Lookout Trail. Director Wieberg recommended no action be taken until a property appraisal can be completed on the current 911 center. No action was taken

Director Wieberg presented a proposal for a Full Appraisal Report to be completed by Kyle Newland of Moore & Shryock (Jefferson City) for the cost of \$2,300.

Ruthie Adams moved to approve the proposal, this was seconded by Dana Wheatley and unanimously approved by the Board.

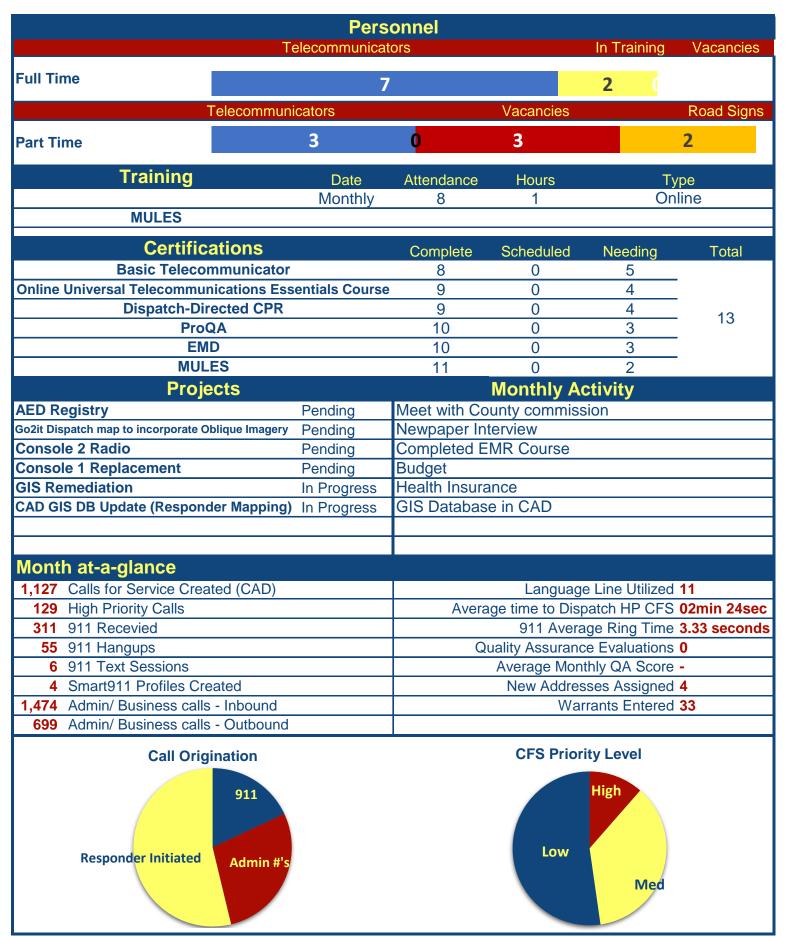

Dear Moniteau County 911 Board Members,

I am writing to propose the purchase of a portion of the lot located at parcel 10-8.0-27-004-000-001.010, with the physical address of 1221 East Buchanan Street, California, Missouri. I have been authorized to negotiate a fair market price for the south half of this parcel for the future use of Moniteau County 911.

We are currently in the process of having the property surveyed to formally divide it into two separate lots. The property has undergone extensive subsurface investigations, carried out by Gredell Engineering Resources, which were completed on August 8, 2023. The investigations covered the following:

- Field Investigation
- Laboratory Investigation
- Sub-surface Conditions
- Engineering Analysis & Recommendations
- Construction Considerations
- Sub-surface Drainage
- Compaction Testing

All reports from these investigations will be made available to Moniteau County 911.

The price for this portion of the lot is set at \$85,000.00 and is non-negotiable. This amount reflects the original purchase price, previous surveys, engineering costs, and acknowledges the transfer to another tax-based public entity. In addition, the Moniteau County 911 Board will agree tocover any additional costs associated with the survey, land transfer, and property line divisions.

Thanks for the information. As we discussed, the appraisal options are summarized below:

Full Appraisal Report - \$2,300 ([50-70 pages] as detailed as we get & customarily completed for litigation, large estate projects, public entities, and most lending purposes)

Restricted Appraisal Report - \$1,800 ([15-30 pages] abbreviated report that requires the same level of inspection, research, and analysis, but will have the same value conclusion & is typically completed for non-public/lender/litigation clients).

Either option can be completed within 45 days from engagement. There may be potential to get it done sooner, but that would depend on when the notice to proceed is received.
