# FOLK MUSIC NOTEBOOK CELEBRATES FIVE YEARS OF STREAMING THE FINEST FOLK!

At 9am Eastern Time on May 3, 2019, **Folk Music Notebook** began streaming folk music, 24 hours a day. Our mission then and our mission now is to present a virtual never-ending folk festival that showcases the diverse styles and artists that make up the contemporary folk community, and also paying homage to the traditions and individuals who built this community.

This Friday, May 3rd, we will celebrate our 5th birthday starting at 9am Eastern Time with a presentation of the music we broadcast during our first hours of Internet broadcasting.

The channel launched on May 3, 2019 because it was also the 100th anniversary of the birth of **Pete Seeger.** We will also honor his legacy again this Friday by showcasing his music throughout the day.

On that very first day of broadcasting, we also did our first live remote when we broadcast a Pete Seeger birthday concert from the Town Crier Cafe in Beacon, New York - a town that Pete called home for decades. Since then, we broadcast concerts from various festivals and music conferences, and during the pandemic, we were honored to stream virtual festivals for the *Kerrville Folk Festival*, the *Falcon Ridge Folk Festival*, the *Goderich Celtic Festival*, and the *Old Songs Festival*. We continue to offer live broadcasts from festivals and

music conferences and also present weekly recorded performances from *Caffe Lena* and *Godfrey Daniels* among other venues.

During the past five years a number of new hosts and programs have been added to our lineup. Each evening and on weekends, these hosts come to us from different parts of the globe and offer their unique perspectives on the living tradition of folk music.
