NEW SERIES PREMIERES THIS WEEK ON FOLK MUSIC NOTEBOOK - *FROM THE KITCHEN TABLE* WITH ROBERT SARAZIN BLAKE



Folk Music Notebook is proud to announce a new series will be joining our lineup. Starting this Thursday, May 19th, at 10pm Eastern / 7pm Pacific, join host **Robert Sarazin Blake** on *From the Kitchen Table*. Each week, Robert and his guests will share a unique connection with each other and the audience through music and conversation.

The series traces its roots to March of 2020 when Robert Sarazin Blake and David Pender Lofgren started a livestream series called *From The Kitchen Table.* After 25 of touring and performing concerts to small groups of people in small rooms, it was immediately and dramatically clear this wouldn't be possible in the near future.

The original vision was to play the last two Sundays in March and all the Sundays in April. By the end of April it was clear the near future was longer than initially anticipated. *From The Kitchen Table* has continued strong for over 2 years, alternating between the backyards of the Pacific NorthWest to David's garage.

During the past 2 years, quality has improved and the team has grown. The essential pieces still remain however, continuing the intimate connection between Robert, his guest, and the audience.

Prior guests have included the likes of **Aoife O'Donovan**, **Willi Carlille** and **Jacob Jolliff**; and an exciting season of great shows, such as a show with **Jim Page** and a stint at the *Mission Folk Festival*, is now underway.

What started as a lockdown emergency measure, now continues as a weekly celebration of song and comradery. We welcome **Robert Sarazin Blake** and *From the Kitchen Table* to the Folk Music Notebook schedule beginning this Thursday May 19th, and you can find the show every Thursday at 10pm ET / 7pm PT.



JOLTIN' JOE PSZONEK ELECTED TO SERFA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Folk Music Notebook's Joltin' Joe Pszonek has been elected to serve a 3-year term as a member of the Board of Director's for SERFA (Southeast Regional Folk Alliance).

Election results were announced May 14 at the SERFA annual conference in Black Mountain, NC. Joltin Joe, along with **Nicholas Edward Williams** and **Adrian Krygowski** will serve a three year term on the board. During the conference Joe emceed a portion of the official showcase concert, was a panelist for workshops about folk radio, and shared his knowledge and experience in one on one mentoring sessions with artists.

Joltin' Joe, heard weekly on Folk Music Notebook as host of two outstanding programs, *Radio Nowhere Worldwide* (Wednesdays at 9pm ET/ 6pm PT) and *The Train Wreck* (Saturday's at 9am ET / 6am PT), has a long history of involvement with the music community and is noted for commitment to helping nurture and promote artists.

Before moving to South Carolina in 2020, Joe spent a number of years actively working with NERFA (the Northeast Regional Folk Alliance) where he was a workshop presenter, guerilla showcase host, mentor, showcase host and a member of the committee to pick showcase talent.

Joe was also a music business executive for 27 years where he worked with many diverse artists, from Garth Brooks to the Red Hot Chili Peppers. His return to radio over a dozen years ago was a welcome addition to the radio community and his shows have been among the most popular on Folk Music Notebook.


