## **Conference Policies:**

- **Delegate Conduct**: All delegates must maintain respectful and diplomatic behaviour during all conference interactions, including formal sessions and informal communication.
- **Attendance**: Delegates are required to attend all sessions unless they have provided prior notice. Failure to attend can lead to disqualification from awards consideration.
- Dress Code: Professional attire is mandatory for all participants during sessions, including opening and closing ceremonies.
- **Research & Preparation**: Delegates must read the background guides and submit position papers on time to be eligible for awards.
- **Position Paper Submission**: Position papers must be submitted by the given deadline. Late submissions will not be considered for awards.
- **Technology Use**: Delegates are responsible for ensuring stable internet and functional devices. Technical issues on the part of the delegate will not be compensated.
- Language: English is the official language, and all speeches, position papers, and communications must be in English.
- **Use of Online Platforms**: Delegates must use the official online platforms for communication. Unauthorized use of external platforms during formal sessions is prohibited.
- Code of Ethics: Plagiarism and intellectual dishonesty are strictly prohibited and will result in disqualification.
- **Awards Criteria**: Awards will be based on a range of factors, including research, collaboration, and adherence to rules.
- **Communication Policy**: Delegates must refrain from using personal communication platforms during committee sessions unless authorized by the executive board.
- Respect for Cultural Sensitivity: Delegates must be respectful of all cultural and national sensitivities during discussions. Disrespectful remarks will lead to penalties.
- Role of Executive Board: The Executive Board has the final authority on committee procedures and decisions. Any complaints must be addressed through proper channels.
- **Delegate Suspension**: NALMUN reserves the right to suspend delegates who violate the rules or create disruptions. Suspended delegates will not be eligible for refunds.
- **General Decorum**: Delegates must maintain a level of decorum that reflects the professionalism of the United Nations and MUN traditions.
