



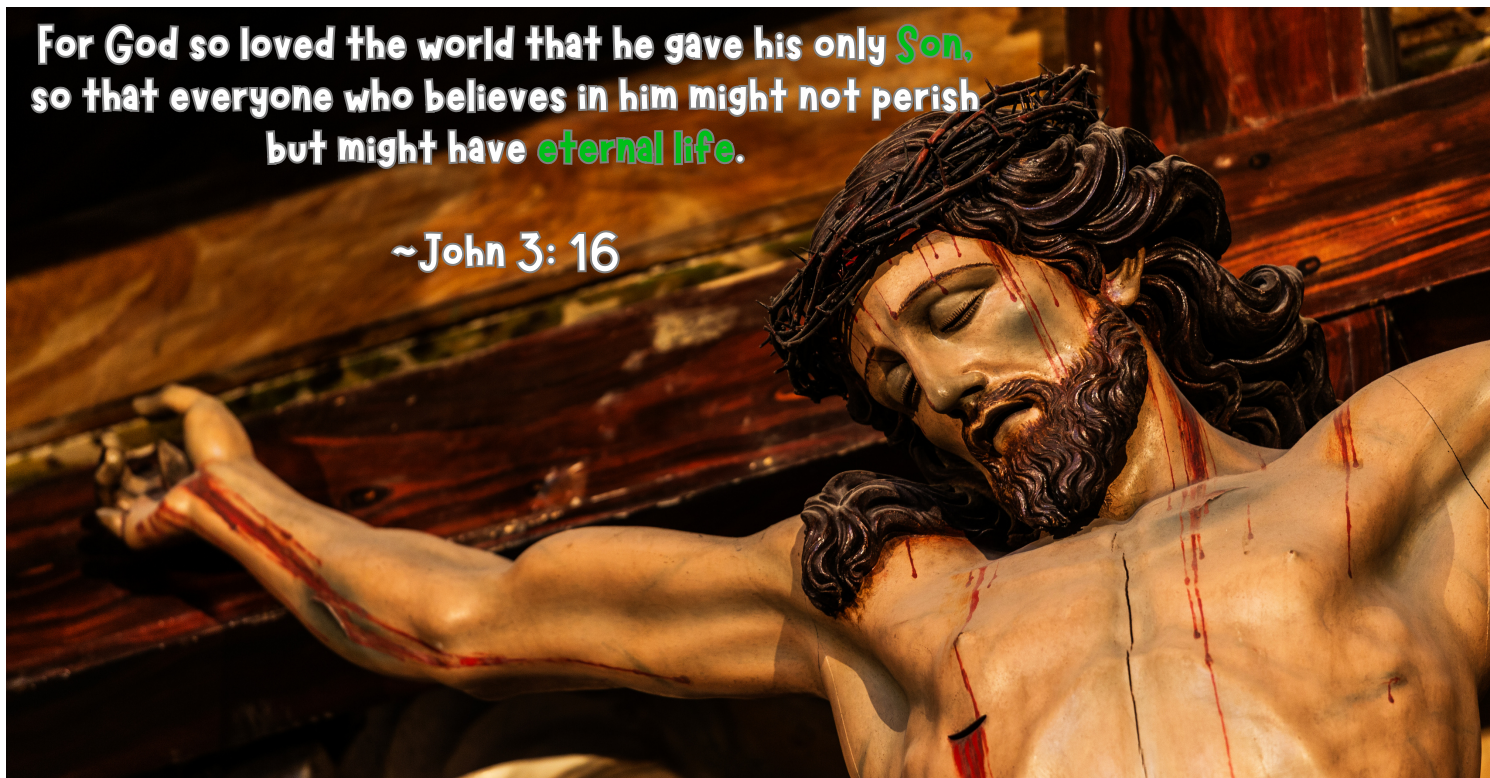

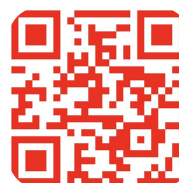

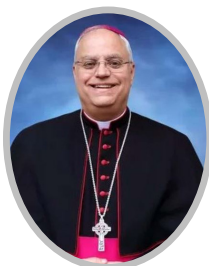

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

RINCÓN DE LA MAYORDOMÍA

Among the primary themes in today's Gospel when we hear Jesus' well-known parable of the Prodigal Son is forgiveness and the need to repent. But from a stewardship point of view what is also interesting is one of the secondary themes: the failure to use responsibly the gifts that have been so generously bestowed. The youngest son who demanded his inheritance and left home broke no laws or religious commandments. His wrong doing was that he wasted his inherited wealth, the abundant gifts given to him. His sin was in his extravagant living; squandering his gifts in pursuit of selfish pleasures. Good stewards acknowledge that everything they have comes from God, and they are required to cultivate these gifts responsibly. What are our God-given gifts? Do we use them responsibly? Do we exercise good stewardship over them?

El hijo menor, que exigió su herencia y abandonó el hogar, no quebrantó ninguna ley ni mandamiento religioso. Su error fue malgastar la riqueza heredada, los abundantes dones que le fueron dados. Su pecado consistió en vivir de forma extravagante, malgastando sus dones en pos de placeres egoístas. Los buenos administradores reconocen que todo lo que poseen proviene de Dios y están obligados a cultivar estos dones con responsabilidad. ¿Cuáles son los dones que Dios nos ha dado? ¿Los usamos responsablemente? ¿Los administramos adecuadamente?

STEWARDSHIP SAINT FOR SEPTEMBER

Saint Teresa of Calcutta gave us an extraordinary example of Christian discipleship and stewardship by her faith, simplicity and service to women and men without considering their race, religion or nationality. She was born Agnes Bojaxhiu in Albania on August 26, 1910, and at age 18 went to Ireland to join the Sisters of Loreto following what she discerned to be a call to become a missionary. She was sent to India in 1929, and began her novitiate in Darjeeling near the Himalayan mountains. Eight years later she made her solemn vows and took the name Teresa after Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, the patron saint of missionaries. From there she taught at the Loreto convent school in Calcutta for almost twenty years. Though a dedicated educator, she was increasingly disturbed by the desperate poverty in Calcutta. On September 10, 1946, Sister Teresa had an extraordinary conversion experience, what she later described as "the call within the call." While traveling by train from Calcutta to the Loreto convent in Darjeeling she experienced interior visions that led her to the conviction that Christ was calling her to serve "the poorest of the poor." In 1948 after a few months of medical training, Sister Teresa ventured out into the slums to tend to the needs of the destitute and starving. Her first year was very difficult. She had no income and had to resort to begging for food and supplies. She experienced loneliness, doubt and the temptation to return to the comfort of convent life. But at the beginning of 1949 she was joined by a group of young women who wished to be a part of her ministry. In 1950 "Mother" Teresa's community was formally recognized by the Vatican. Its mission was to care for, in her own words, "the hungry, the naked, the homeless, the crippled, the blind, the lepers, all those people who feel unwanted, unloved, uncared for throughout society, people that have become a burden to the society and are shunned by everyone." In 1952, she opened a hospice for the poor. Then she established several leprosy clinics throughout Calcutta, providing medication, bandages and food. In 1955, she created a home for orphans and homeless youth. The Missionaries of Charity soon began to attract both recruits and charitable donations, and by the 1960s had opened hospices, orphanages and leper homes all over India. Mother Teresa then went global. Her first mission outside of India was in Venezuela in 1965, then in Rome, Tanzania and Austria. During the 1970s the congregation started missions in dozens of countries in Asia, Africa, Europe and the United States. In 1979, she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. Mother Teresa died on September 5, 1997, departing a religious community with over 4,000 sisters operating 610 missions in 123 countries and aided by more than one million co-workers. Former U.N. Secretary General, Javier Pérez de Cuéllar, said of Saint Teresa: "She is the United Nations. She is peace in the world." Saint Teresa of Calcutta was canonized on September 4, 2016 by Pope Francis. Her feast day is September 5. S

SANTO DE LA MAYORDOMÍA PARA SEPTIEMBRE

Santa Teresa de Calcuta nos dio un ejemplo extraordinario de discipulado cristiano y administración de los recursos mediante su fe, sencillez y servicio a mujeres y hombres sin importar su raza, religión o nacionalidad. Nació con el nombre de Agnes Bojaxhiu en Albania el 26 de agosto de 1910 y, a los 18 años, viajó a Irlanda para unirse a las Hermanas de Loreto, siguiendo lo que percibió como una vocación misionera. Fue enviada a la India en 1929 y comenzó su noviciado en Darjeeling, cerca del Himalaya. Ocho años después, hizo sus votos solemnes y adoptó el nombre de Teresa en honor a Santa Teresita de Lisieux, patrona de los misioneros. Desde allí, enseñó en la escuela del convento de Loreto en Calcuta durante casi veinte años. Aunque fue una educadora dedicada, la pobreza extrema de Calcuta la perturbaba cada vez más. El 10 de septiembre de 1946, la Hermana Teresa tuvo una extraordinaria experiencia de conversión, lo que más tarde describió como «la vocación dentro de la vocación». Mientras viajaba en tren desde Calcuta al convento de Loreto en Darjeeling, experimentó visiones interiores que la llevaron a la convicción de que Cristo la llamaba a servir a los más pobres entre los pobres. En 1948, tras unos meses de formación médica, la Hermana Teresa se aventuró a recorrer los barrios marginales para atender las necesidades de los desposeídos y hambrientos. Su primer año fue muy difícil. Carecía de ingresos y tuvo que recurrir a la mendicidad para conseguir comida y provisiones. Experimentó la soledad, la duda y la tentación de volver a la comodidad de la vida conventual. Pero a principios de 1949 se unió a ella un grupo de jóvenes que deseaban formar parte de su ministerio. En 1950, la comunidad de la "Madre" Teresa fue reconocida formalmente por el Vaticano. Su misión era cuidar, en sus propias palabras, a "los hambrientos, los desnudos, los sin techo, los lisiados, los ciegos, los leprosos, todas aquellas personas que se sienten indeseadas, no queridas, desatendidas en toda la sociedad, personas que se han convertido en una carga para la sociedad y son rechazadas por todos". En 1952, abrió un hospicio para los pobres. Luego estableció varias clínicas de lepra en Calcuta, proporcionando medicamentos, vendajes y alimentos. En 1955, creó un hogar para huérfanos y jóvenes sin hogar. Las Misioneras de la Caridad pronto comenzaron a atraer tanto reclutas como donaciones caritativas, y para la década de 1960 habían abierto hospicios, orfanatos y hogares para leprosos en toda la India. La Madre Teresa luego se globalizó. Su primera misión fuera de la India fue en Venezuela en 1965, luego en Roma, Tanzania y Austria. Durante la década de 1970, la congregación comenzó misiones en docenas de países de Asia, África, Europa y Estados Unidos. En 1979, recibió el Premio Nobel de la Paz. La Madre Teresa falleció el 5 de septiembre de 1997, dejando una comunidad religiosa con más de 4.000 hermanas que operaban 610 misiones en 123 países y con la ayuda de más de un millón de colaboradores. El exsecretario general de la ONU, Javier Pérez de Cuéllar, dijo de Santa Teresa: «Ella es las Naciones Unidas. Ella es la paz en el mundo». Santa Teresa de Calcuta fue canonizada el 4 de septiembre de 2016 por el papa Francisco. Su festividad se celebra el 5 de septiembre.
