Dear Church,

Today is the last Sunday of Ordinary Time before we begin the Lenten season. The Gospel challenges us to self-reflection and discernment before we call out others' weaknesses. Jesus cautions that we must "remove the wooden beam from [our eyes] first." When have we been hypocritical in our actions?

Today's Gospel reading is from Luke's narration of Jesus' sermon on the plain and reads a lot like Jewish wisdom literature. Jesus presents a series of pithy remarks on practical ways to participate in the work of the Lord. From these teaching we question whether the blind (read: uninformed) can lead others. Jesus calls on his Jewish scriptural tradition for such teachings, and the verses from Sirach punctuate this wisdom. In the biblical tradition, there is no more powerful challenge to think before speaking. Our speech, says Sirach, is the primary testament to our integrity and concern for justice.



Querida Iglesia,

Hoy es el último domingo del Tiempo Ordinario antes de comenzar la temporada de Cuaresma. El Evangelio nos desafía a la autorreflexión y al discernimiento antes de denunciar las debilidades de los demás. Jesús advierte que debemos "quitar primero la viga de madera de [nuestros ojos]". ¿Cuándo hemos sido hipócritas en nuestras acciones?

La lectura del Evangelio de hoy proviene de la narración de Lucas del sermón de Jesús en la llanura y se parece mucho a la literatura sapiencial judía. Jesús presenta una serie de comentarios concisos sobre formas prácticas de participar en la obra del Señor. A partir de estas enseñanzas nos preguntamos si los ciegos (léase: desinformados) pueden guiar a otros. Jesús invoca su tradición escritural judía para tales enseñanzas, y los versículos del Eclesiástico acentúan esta sabiduría. En la tradición bíblica, no hay desafío más poderoso que pensar antes de hablar. Nuestro discurso, dice Sirach, es el principal testimonio de nuestra integridad y preocupación por la justicia.

Managing God's Gifts To Us

Christian Stewards: “Blessed, Grateful, Giving”

While I am often drawn to reflect on these three words and their deep spiritual meaning, it has always seemed to me that the words are “misplaced,” in reverse order. First, we are blessed. The initiative is always on the part of God. In fact, we are and will always be more richly blessed than we can begin to comprehend. God loves us first. The more deeply we come to know our blessedness, and grasp that our blessed state is an outpouring of the grace of God, the greater must be our growth in gratitude, in thankfulness.

The life and growth of the steward is of recognizing the blessings and growing in gratitude for them, which leads to our grateful response. The plaque on the wall should read, I believe, “blessed, grateful, thankful.” Or better yet, “blessed, grateful, giving.” On our best days, we are keenly aware of the blessings of life: faith, relationships, talents, gifts, and resources. We are awake to and aware of the world around us and see God’s hand in all of creation. Yet in our human frailty, we lose sight. We fail to perceive and become blind to the blessings within and around us. We even go so far as to take it all for granted, and sometimes yearn for more, searching for more earthly wealth and material riches rather than seeking and finding what is always there — the presence of God in our very midst. In this extended moment of Ordinary Time before Lent, let us be mindful that nothing in this life is “ordinary.” All is extraordinarily and abundantly filled with the life and grace of God, which we are called to steward well.

Estamos despiertos y conscientes del mundo que nos rodea y vemos la mano de Dios en toda la creación. Sin embargo, en nuestra fragilidad humana, perdemos la visión. No logramos percibir y nos volvemos ciegos a las bendiciones dentro y alrededor de nosotros. Incluso llegamos al punto de darlo todo por sentado, y a veces anhelamos más, buscando más riquezas terrenales y materiales en lugar de buscar y encontrar lo que siempre está ahí: la presencia de Dios en medio de nosotros. En este momento prolongado del Tiempo Ordinario antes de la Cuaresma, seamos conscientes de que nada en esta vida es “ordinario”. Todo está extraordinariamente y abundantemente lleno de la vida y la gracia de Dios, que estamos llamados a administrar bien.
