STEWARDSHIP



Christian Stewards: People of the Resurrection

For those immersed in the secular world, Easter is long over. The pastel bunnies, the chocolate eggs, the color-splashed jelly beans which appeared in the marketplace so temptingly just as Christians were beginning the fasting of Lent, have long been swept from the store shelves to be replaced in anticipation of the next marketable holiday. For the Christian steward, how backward this all seems. Yes, we believe that the Paschal mystery and the life-changing events of Easter are not over. They are not an end but a triumphal beginning, and they have altered us in a quite radical way.

The mystery and miracle of Easter challenge us to live as different people, as people of the Resurrection. What does this mean? For those new Catholics who participated in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), a period of mystagogy helps to understand this mystery. Indeed, this ancient Greek word actually means “to lead through the mysteries.” During mystagogia, many parishes introduce their new members to service in a quite practical way. Here are the ministries of the parish; here are the charities we support; here are the needs of our community and our congregation. How do you choose to live out your faith in the Resurrection in a quite tangible and real way? How do your gifts fit into our needs? Essentially, however, this is a question that the Easter season calls forth in all Christian stewards not just our newest members.

We have lived through Lent and the Paschal mysteries, all the while trying to deepen a relationship with the person of Christ. It’s as simple, yet as amazing and complex as that. The deeper the relationship grows, the more we become rooted in it, the more this relationship with Christ comes to dominate our lives. We no longer compartmentalize Jesus, we hold him at our center. And the mysteries lead us to the fundamental question at the heart of all Christian stewardship, the question that Easter compels us to ask: How do I steward my resources – my time, my money, my abilities and gifts, my very life – so that they are in service to the Kingdom of God? It’s not a part-time question. It’s not a seasonal question that’s swept off the shelf periodically. It’s the basic question which the Easter season demands of us: Jesus, how do you want me to serve you?

Mayordomos Cristianos: Pueblo de la Resurrección

Para aquellos inmersos en el mundo secular, la Pascua ya pasó. Los conejitos de color pastel, los huevos de chocolate, las gominolas salpicadas de colores que aparecieron en el mercado tan tentadoramente justo cuando los cristianos comenzaban el ayuno de Cuaresma, han sido barridos de los estantes de las tiendas hace mucho tiempo para ser reemplazados en anticipación de la próxima festividad comercial. Para el mayordomo cristiano, qué atrasado parece todo esto. Sí, creemos que el misterio pascual y los eventos de Pascua que cambian la vida no han terminado. No son un final sino un comienzo triunfal, y nos han alterado de una manera bastante radical.

El misterio y el milagro de la Pascua nos interpelan a vivir como personas diferentes, como personas de la Resurrección. ¿Qué quiere decir esto? Para aquellos nuevos católicos que participaron en el Rito de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos (RICA), un período de mistagogia ayuda a comprender este misterio. De hecho, esta antigua palabra griega en realidad significa “conducir a través de los misterios”. Durante la mistagogia, muchas parroquias introducen a sus nuevos miembros al servicio de una manera bastante práctica. Aquí están los ministerios de la parroquia; aquí están las organizaciones benéficas que apoyamos; aquí están las necesidades de nuestra comunidad y nuestra congregación. ¿Cómo eliges vivir tu fe en la Resurrección de una manera bastante tangible y real? ¿Cómo encajan sus dones en nuestras necesidades? Esencialmente, sin embargo, esta es una pregunta que la temporada de Pascua suscita en todos los administradores cristianos, no solo en nuestros miembros más nuevos.

Hemos vivido la Cuaresma y los misterios pascuales, tratando todo el tiempo de profundizar una relación con la persona de Cristo. Es tan simple, pero tan sorprendente y complejo como eso. Cuanto más profunda crece la relación, cuanto más nos arraigamos en ella, más esta relación con Cristo llega a dominar nuestras vidas. Ya no compartimentamos a Jesús, lo tenemos en nuestro centro. Y los misterios nos llevan a la pregunta fundamental en el corazón de toda la corresponsabilidad cristiana, la pregunta que la Pascua nos obliga a hacernos: ¿Cómo administro mis recursos, mi tiempo, mi dinero, mis habilidades y dones, mi propia vida, para que estén al servicio del Reino de Dios? No es una pregunta de medio tiempo. No es una pregunta estacional que se elimina periódicamente. Es la pregunta básica que nos exige el tiempo pascual: Jesús, ¿cómo quieres que te sirva?
