September 27 (St. Vincent de Paul)



"Give me a man of prayer and he will be capable of everything," said St. Vincent de Paul (1581-1660). Through own conversion and being touched by the 'fire of love' in the heart of incarnate Son of God*, St. Vincent encountered Christ in the abandoned babies, material and spiritual poor, slaves rowing in a galley, and most of all, within himself. He realized the need to organize works of charity, which led to establish the Confraternity of Charity (1617), the Congregation of the Mission (1625, Vincentian priests and brothers), and the Daughters of Charity (1633). To evangelize the poor, St. Vincent de Paul also dedicated to form the clergy members by giving conferences and retreats to the bishops, priests and seminarians. On this 400th anniversary of foundation, now the Congregation of the Mission is serving in 102 countries with over 2,900 priests and brothers. With the Association of the Miraculous Medal (1830), the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (1833), and many other Vincentian Family institutions inspired by St. Vincent de Paul, together we continue striving to imitate Christ, evangelizing the poor and being evangelized by them. 27 de septiembre (San Vicente de Paúl)

"Dame un hombre de oración y será capaz de todo", dijo San Vicente de Paúl (1581-1660). A través de su propia conversión y tocado por 'el fuego del amor' en el corazón del Hijo de Dios encarnado*, San Vicente encontró a Cristo en los bebés abandonados, en los pobres materiales y espirituales, en los esclavos que remaban en una galera y, sobre todo, en sí mismo. Comprendió la necesidad de organizar obras de caridad, lo que llevó a fundar la Cofradía de la Caridad (1617), la Congregación de la Misión (1625, padres y hermanos Vicentinos) y las Hijas de la Caridad (1633). Para evangelizar a los pobres, San Vicente de Paúl también se dedicó a la formación del clero impartiendo conferencias y retiros a obispos, sacerdotes y seminaristas. En este 400 aniversario de su fundación, la Congregación de la Misión presta servicio en 102 países con más de 2900 sacerdotes y hermanos. Con la Asociación de la Medalla Milagrosa (1830), la Sociedad de San Vicente de Paúl (1833) y muchas otras instituciones de la Familia Vicenciana inspiradas en San Vicente de Paúl, juntos seguimos esforzándonos por imitar a Cristo, evangelizando a los pobres y siendo evangelizados por ellos. 

STEWARDSHIP CORNER By: Bill Vigil RINCON DE LA MAYORDOMÍA

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, a story so well known to us Christians that we might take it for granted. We need to listen to it with fresh ears and an open mind.

The rich man lived a lavish lifestyle. His heart was hardened by his failure to see or acknowledge Lazarus, the poor man who begged at his door. When they both died and entered eternity, the rich man tried to use Lazarus as a means to save his brothers, despite his lack of care for the beggar during his earthly life. That concern for family may have been commendable but it demonstrated his failure to trust God's word (the reference to Moses and the prophets).

I don't think the message of this parable is to simply say that the poor will go to heaven and the rich won't. But perhaps it shakes our complacency as we consider our world today. There are consequences for how we live our lives, not just for ourselves but for others, too.

Jesus teaches us: Be mindful of the poor who are so easily ignored. Without an eye for the needy around us, our lives become empty and self-centered. Jesus identified with the poor, the diseased and the outcast. He walked among of them and brought them hope, even as his presence and his message made the well-to-do squirm and the self-reliant uncomfortable.

This parable reminds us of the huge inequality of people in Jesus' time, an inequality that still exists today. Jesus issues a challenge: Are we too comfortable in worldly wealth and possessions, in comparison with those in our midst who are barely surviving? Can we open our eyes and our hearts to those on our doorstep, on our city streets, and even in our own families – those who might be forgotten, ignored, and in need? ~excerpt from: Liturgy Blog: a weekly liturgical planning resource

El hombre rico vivía una vida de lujo. Su corazón se endureció al no ver ni reconocer a Lázaro, el pobre que mendigaba a su puerta. Cuando ambos murieron y entraron en la eternidad, el hombre rico intentó usar a Lázaro como medio para salvar a sus hermanos, a pesar de su desinterés por el mendigo durante su vida terrenal. Esa preocupación por la familia puede haber sido encomiable, pero demostró su falta de confianza en la palabra de Dios (la referencia a Moisés y los

No creo que el mensaje de esta parábola sea simplemente decir que los pobres irán al cielo y los ricos no. Pero quizás sacude nuestra complacencia al considerar nuestro mundo actual. Hay consecuencias en cómo vivimos, no solo para nosotros mismos, sino también para los demás. Jesús nos enseña: Tengamos presente a los pobres, a quienes tan fácilmente ignoramos. Sin una mirada hacia los necesitados que nos rodean, nuestras vidas se vuelven vacías y egocéntricas. Jesús se identificó con los pobres, los enfermos y los marginados. Caminó entre ellos y les trajo esperanza, aun cuando su presencia y su mensaje incomodaban a los adinerados y a los autosuficientes.

Esta parábola nos recuerda la enorme desigualdad de las personas en la época de Jesús, una desigualdad que aún existe hoy. Jesús nos desafía: ¿Nos sentimos demasiado cómodos con las riquezas y posesiones mundanas, en comparación con quienes a nuestro alrededor apenas sobreviven? ¿Podemos abrir los ojos y el corazón a quienes nos rodean, en las calles de nuestra ciudad e incluso en nuestras propias familias, a aquellos que podrían estar olvidados, ignorados y necesitados? ~ Extracto de: Blog de Liturgia: un recurso semanal para la planificación litúrgica
