
the less fortunate, caring about our veterans, caring about child abuse, about our community, and caring about our youth.

An award is presented to two district newsletter editors at the National Convention: one for those districts with up to 799 members (which was within the size of the Lakes & Prairies District), and one for those 800 members or larger. The entries are judged by a panel of professionals with experience in writing, newspaper, or periodical editing, or related communications field. The newsletter submissions were judged on district news coverage, club news coverage, national news and promotion, Exchange education, layout, and eye appeal, writing quality, improvement, and frequency of publication. Randy was also presented an EDIT Award in 2022.



of Waseca's C.A.R.E Award during The National Exchange Club Convention in Louisville. C.A.R.E. is for Child Abuse Reduction Effort. There are three National recipients. One for those clubs up to 29 members, which was in Waseca's category; one for those with 30 to 74 members; and one for those with 75 or more members. National recognizes Exchange clubs that sponsor the most effective and far-reaching projects. Awards are presented for projects both related to a local Exchange Club Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse, as well as projects not related to a Center. Each recipient had the opportunity to display their project during the Convention. The nominated project must be conducted after July 1 and completed prior to June 1. Applications must be submitted to The National Exchange Club by June 1.
