45 years of creating friendships with persons with an intellectual disability

Faith and Light is an ecumenical association filled with communities made up of persons with an intellectual disability, their families and friends, particularly young friends, who meet together on a regular basis in a Christian spirit, to share friendship, pray together, fiesta and celebrate life.

The History

In 1968, persons with an intellectual disability were not considered as having a place among participants in pilgrimages. People thought that they were not capable of experiencing this kind of activity and that their presence would possibly disturb other pilgrims. In response to an appeal by the parents of Thaddée and Loïc, two children with an intellectual disability, Jean Vanier and Marie-Hélène Mathieu organized a pilgrimage to Lourdes with them. Three years of preparation ensued, which gave rise to strong reactions of both enthusiasm and reserve.

At Easter 1971, 12 000 pilgrims from 15 countries, 4,000 of whom were persons with an intellectual disability, assembled again. Carried away by the experience, they wanted to continue the adventure. Jean Vanier suggested: “Continue meeting together in small communities, **do whatever the Holy Spirit inspires you to do**”.

Faith and Light was born, Easter Monday 1971, in Lourdes.
