Get in (Electronic) Line for COVID-19 Vaccine! Here's how:

Step 1: Fill out the registration form at <https://vaccinenm.org>.
You will receive a confirmation code.

Step 2: Complete your profile.

- Use your confirmation code and birthdate to access your profile.

Answer questions about your:

- Chronic medical conditions
- Employer
- Health Insurance
- Age, ethnicity, marital status, etc.

Note: Your answers will only be used to determine when you are eligible for vaccination. They will not be shared with anyone.

Step 3: Wait for the New Mexico Department of Health to send you an invitation to an event. Your invite will include an event code.

Step 4: Schedule your COVID-19 vaccine appointment

- Enter your event code
- Select a location and a day
- Schedule your appointment!

Step 5: Receive the COVID-19 vaccine

- Complete the medical questionnaire on the day of your appointment
- Go to the location and receive your COVID-19 vaccine
- Schedule an appointment for your second dose of COVID-19 vaccine

Help Stop the spread of COVID-19. Get Tested!

TESTING IS FREE!

Why get tested for COVID-19?

You can have COVID-19 and not feel sick. That means you can unknowingly spread the disease to others.

If you have COVID-19, getting tested can help you get health care and other help.

If you get tested and don't have COVID-19, you are helping our community reopen. The greater the number of negative test results, the lower the **test positivity rate**. A test positivity rate of less than 5% is one of two criteria the state uses to determine whether a community can reopen.

Remember: If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or if you've been near someone who has (or probably has) COVID-19, you should stay home and away from others until you get your test result.

Vaccinated or not, follow the Three W's

Watch your distance: Stay at least 6 feet away from other people

Wear your mask: Your mask goes over your mouth *and* nose.

Wash your hands: Use warm water and lots of soap.

Rub gently (don't scrub!) for 20 seconds, front and back and in between fingers.
