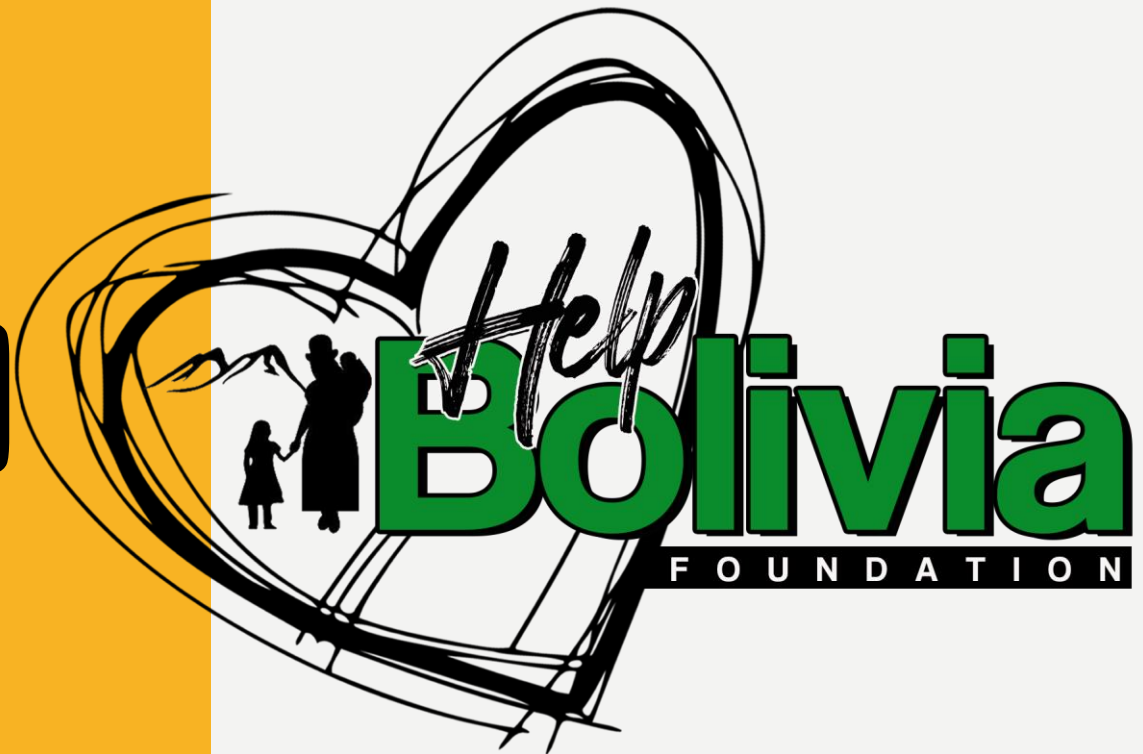
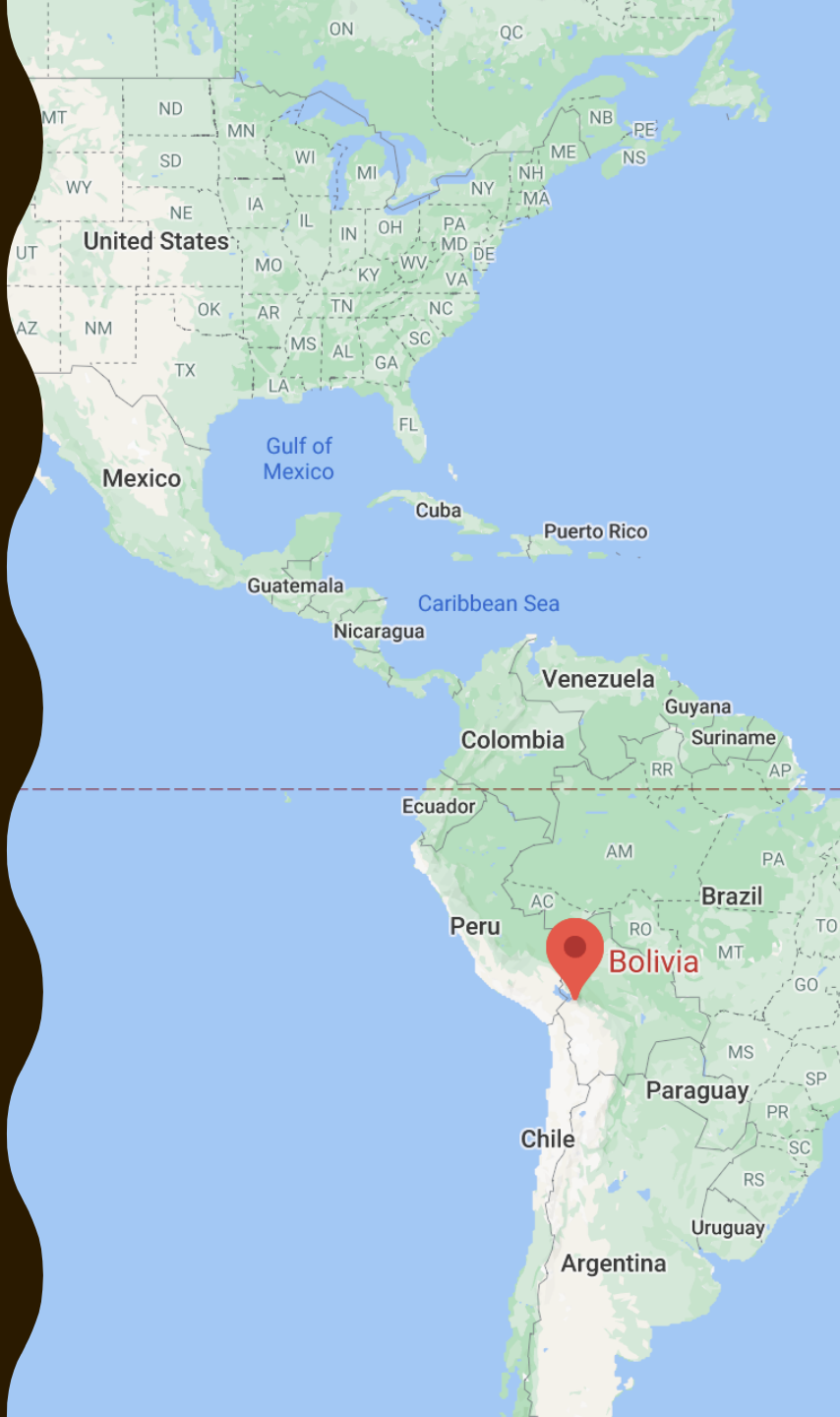

ABOUT BOLIVIA

- Bolivia is a country in South America.
- Nearly 40% of Bolivians earn less than \$2 a day.
- 88% of Bolivia's citizens identify as Indigenous.
- In Bolivia, the education system struggles to meet the needs of youth due to a lack of money.
- Most children attend primary school, but most of these children do not continue to secondary school, and many of those who do, do not finish.
- Many don't get an education because they have to worry about providing for their families at a young age.
- The average age at which a child leaves school in Bolivia is 14 years old.
- In Bolivia, the Indigenous population is more affected by the country's barriers to education.

OUR WORK IN EL ALTO, BOLIVIA

- Our charity was created in 2018 to help Bolivian families living in poverty.
- We work at the Tahuantinsuyo Community Centre, a community centre in El Alto, Bolivia.
- El Alto is the fastest-growing city in Bolivia!
- The majority of the citizens in this city are part of the Indigenous population of the Aymara.
- Our programs support families who have migrated to this city to give their children a better life.
- The families we support live under extreme poverty. Many times the kids don't have enough food, have trouble learning, or have been victims of abandonment or abuse. Many kids only have one parent.



WHAT DOES THE HELP BOLIVIA FOUNDATION DO?

- The Help Bolivia Foundation was created in 2018 to help Bolivian families that are living in extreme poverty
- Our programs include:
- **Nutrition Program** - Children need food and energy in order to succeed in school. Through our program, kids receive a nutritious hot lunch, and nutritious snacks in the morning and afternoon that help them learn!
- **Education Program** - Did you know that children in Bolivia attend school for only half the day? This program gives kids the extra after-school support they need to succeed!
- **Psychological Support** - Children come to the Tahuantinsuyo Community Centre when they are in unsafe situations and may be in danger. Help Bolivia helps address this problem by giving them a safe space and someone to talk to.
