Did you know that the Commissioner of Public Lands Vote came down to 51 votes?



Some interesting observations from the Secretary of State Website:

- ➤ The only group where more that half of registered voters turned in ballots was those 65 and older.
- 1.25% of the ballots are challenged, meaning a signature is missing or it is a mismatch with the records. In the case of recounts, the candidates' campaign can try to help resolve these by letting people know. Currently there are over 25,000 challenged votes. This could make a difference in the race for Commissioner of Public Lands.
- In previous Presidential election years, there was about 80% turnout of eligible voters. This Primary had 41% Turnout, so roughly half of the number expected in November
- Roughly 60% of voters used the ballot collection drop boxes.
- ➤ The second picture shows how much lower 2024 turnout was than 2020.
