Paraty Marin

What awaits you?

Paraty Marin is a beautiful property located on Araujo Island, which is 10km from the Historic Center of Paraty.

Araújo Island is the second largest island in the bay of Paraty and has a local (caiçara) population of approximately 600 people. It is possible to hike (medium difficulty) around the island to learn a little bit about local life. In the village you'll find a bakery, local restaurants, a charming church by the sea and much more. Everything is quite simple, but very nice! You can also take the opportunity to visit some of the islands beaches – the most beautiful being "Praia do Salvador Moreira" or "Praia da Tapera".

Paraty Marin is located on the far outer side of the island, therefore has a privileged view of the bay of Paraty.

At Paraty Marin

At Paraty Marin you will find three houses built in the colonial style of the region, and a beautiful mainhouse.

We have several meticulously cared for gardens, trails between native palm heart forests, a beautiful exclusive beach, a water mirror, two access piers and much more!

Breakfast is served daily at the mainhouse between 8.30 and 10.30 hrs.



Rules & Tips

We ask all our guests to pay attention to the following rules and tips to ensure a harmonious coexistence between people and the environment. Remember that you are on a relatively small island, with limited resources and difficult access.



- Please respect the "dress-code" of the main house and do not wear wet or damp swimsuits when sitting on the furniture of the houses
- Please respect our other guests and do not listen to loud music in any area of Paraty Marin
- Don't throw ANYTHING in the toilets! Not even paper. Super important! If you are traveling with children, please inform them...
- Please try to conserve water! Especially during high season...
- Turn off the A/C and lights when not in use
- Don't smoke inside the house
- Don't take food to the rooms!
- Do not leave food scraps, or food packages open and exposed. Store all leftovers in the refrigerator or in the oven.
- Don't walk into the forest or far from our pathways! Remember that you are surrounded by the Atlantic Forest
- To hike around the island we recommend wearing closed-toed shoes

- Don't leave anything unattended on the beach. The tide rises and can take it.
 This is valid for both personal items and our kayaks and SUP boards
- Don't walk on rocks or on the boat ramp. Watch out for the large rock on the far edge of our beach... it's very slippery!
- Do not drag kayaks or SUP boards over rocks and always make sure that the keel of the board is not touching the bottom. The keels are sensitive and break easily
- Do not use the oars to support yourself, get away from rocks or as a shovel. They are fragile items that break easily.
- We wash, dry and iron all our linens on the island. We always try to use special detergents and maximize the use of the sun and the breeze to dry washed items. Change of sheets and towels is done every three days.
- If you need to wash clothes (we ask that this is done as little as possible!), wait until you have a full basket. Our team will take care of your clothes, while minimizing the impact to the environment.
- Please be careful when applying sunscreen. Some leave terrible stains behind that cannot be removed from sheets and towels.
- To minimize the impact on the environment, we separated all garbage generated on the property into 3 categories:
- **1.** All NON-biodegradable waste (papers, plastics, etc.)
- 2. Glasses and Cans
- **3.** All organic material (biodegradable) and food scraps

We ask you to help us keep the island clean and beautiful!
