THE HOLY GOSPEL

Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew.

So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Confession

Invitation

P: Friends in Christ, every year at the time of our Lord Jesus Christ's Passover from death to life, with the church throughout the world we celebrate our redemption from sin, death and the devil. Lent is a time to renew our life in the paschal mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection, which we participate in through the sacramental life of the church. It is a time to prepare candidates for baptism and holy communion.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ. We show our resolve to amend our lives with the sign of ashes, which speak of our mortality and symbolize our repentance. I invite you, therefore, to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by almsgiving and works of love, and by attending to the word of God and receiving the sacraments

of Christ as we journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. *(silence for reflection)*

P: Most holy and merciful God,

C: We confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault, by our own fault, by our own most grievous fault, in thought, word, and deed by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

P: We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven.

C: Have mercy on us.

P: We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

C: Have mercy on us.

P: We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness. The pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives, we confess to you.

C: Have mercy on us.

P: Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people, we confess to you,

C: Have mercy on us.

P: Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves, we confess to you,

C: Have mercy on us.

P: Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work, we confess to you,

C: Have mercy on us.

P: Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to comment the faith that is in us, we confess to you,

C: Have mercy on us.

P: Our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty, we confess to you,

C: Have mercy on us.

P: Our false judgments, our uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, we confess to you,

C: Have mercy on us.

P: Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us, we confess to you,

C: Have mercy on us.

P: Restore us, O Lord, and let your anger depart from us. C: Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great. Amen.

Conclusion of the Confession

P: Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation,

C: that we may show forth your glory in the world.

P: By the cross and Passion of your Son, our Lord,

C: bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.

P: Almighty God, have mercy on us forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. **C: Amen**
