# Property and Building Updates

- Kitchen stove ventilation cleaning and inspection was completed.
- New exterior trim was installed on the door at the Chapel entrance.
- New rain and down spouting installed in the Chapel area.
- The parking lot light timer needed to be replaced.
- A problem with a carbon monoxide detector turned out to be a breaker issue. The breaker was repaired.
- A motion light was installed outside of the office entrance to improve lighting after dark.
- Fire extinguisher inspection was updated and performed.
- Mandatory state boiler inspection was completed.
- There were 2 small and 1 large snow events that needed addressed. Thanks to Fairfield Landscaping for snow removal and salting of walks.
- On Jan 22nd it was discovered we lost all heat to the sanctuary. The problem was a blower part that is not an off the shelf item. After ordering, shipping, and installing, we now have heat again. Unfortunately this all occurred during some of the coldest weather in years. Upon start up a burst water line was found in the front vestibule. This was capped, but will need to be addressed moving forward.

- Pastor's Report- Pastor Wayne reported that confirmation class is going very well. The students are ready to study Exodus and Moses. As per his contract, Pastor Wayne will be away one weekend per month. The Rev. Dr. H. Lee Brumback will be filling in the second Sunday of each month.
- Treasurer's Report- Sandy Kump reported that our finances ended up in the black for 2025 with a balance of approximately \$5,400.00. Cash Day will be coming up on Palm Sunday and we will be deciding on the target area for this year. We have a total of \$240,000 in all of the endowment funds.
- A total of \$3,570 was sent to Flohr's Church for the family who lost their home and belongings in a fire in Orrtanna in November. We received a thank you note.
- Stacey Haynes and Barb Booz have agreed to work on the newsletter. They will be collecting information and reports and plan to publish an issue mid-February.
- Barb Booz has been taking pictures for the new directory. The first pictures were taken January 11, 2026.
- Chris Cool reported on repairs and maintenance done around the church. A new timer was installed for the parking lot lights. Bags of salt were purchased and placed at each doorway, and a motion light was installed at the steps of the parsonage. We received an estimate on the decking project for the parsonage. It may be a little more costly than previously stated. (\$4,500) Fire extinguishers were inspected and passed, and the 3 boilers were inspected and were up to date. New project- we need a handrail to assist getting up to the lectern. This will be investigated. We are having a mouse problem. All refreshments will be moved to the social hall. Chris has been very busy and we greatly appreciate all that he does!
- The Call Committee will be meeting after church on January 18. They will be going through the ministry site profile.

The season of Lent begins this year on February 18<sup>th</sup>, Ash Wednesday. Lent is a time when we pause to remember Jesus' time in the wilderness facing temptations. It is a time when we reflect on Jesus as he deliberately makes his way to Jerusalem and the cross. This year, in the season of Lent I invite you to reflect on what Jesus did not only for you, but for all people. I invite you to honestly reflect on the voices, the influences, the ideologies that influence how you live in and relate to the world around you. Are they in line with the one whom God called you to listen to? How does God's command to listen to Jesus impact your life as a disciple of Christ?

In Matthew 4:17 Jesus told us to "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." As I said on the 1<sup>st</sup>, repent does not mean listing your sins and feeling bad for them. No, repent here means to see the world through new eyes. It's a change of mind. It means you follow God's command to listen to Jesus above any other message that you may hear in the world. Sadly, too many people are being influenced by competing ideologies and following them because they are attractive. Because their friends are following them. Listening to Jesus may mean something inside of you needs to die. It may mean you need to recalibrate, to change your mind, to reconsider and prayerfully ask God to change your heart.

I realize that this is not easy but the situation in our nation today requires the Church to take a stand against the competing voices that push people away rather than gather them in. God has called you to listen to Jesus. To see the world through the loving, merciful, and compassionate eyes of Jesus. In this season of Lent read the Gospel of Matthew and pay close attention to Jesus welcomes in and who he speaks against.

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is wonderful news for all of you. Jesus, the Son of God has come! Repentance is a wonderful experience! It opens your eyes to the world as God sees it. It sets you free to love and serve your neighbors, all your neighbors. In this season of Lent, I invite you to prayerfully listen to the voice of Jesus and see the world as Jesus sees it.

# Ruth's Harvest- Fairfield

Through rain, snow, sleet and freezing rain, Ruth's Harvest-Fairfield volunteers pack and deliver weekend bags of food to those students within the Fairfield Area School District who are food insecure.

The number of backpacks we prepare weekly has so far, stayed consistent this year. We are currently packing 48 bags each week. The bags are usually packed on Tuesdays and delivered to the schools on Thursdays. Each bag contains approximately 25 food items. Additional items are added for long holiday weekends, and because of the lengthy winter break this year, an additional backpack was packed and delivered prior to the last day of school before the break. We also recognize each elementary student receiving a Ruth's Harvest-Fairfield bag with a card, a pencil and a special treat during their birthday week.
