"Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in

and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:4-7 NRSV

RUTH'S HARVEST

We started the school year with a lower number of students participating in the Ruth's Harvest-Fairfield (RH-F) backpack program than we anticipated, but that didn't last long. We are currently packing bags for 45 students. Thirty-one (31) elementary students, 10 middle school students and 4 high school students are receiving RH-F bags each week.

As you may have read in the Gettysburg Times a few weeks ago, the Gettysburg Community Foundation awarded the RH-F program with a grant of \$2,500.00. What a surprise and a blessing that was! In one year, we are required to provide the foundation with a report on how the grant money was used to support the students in our community. With that in mind and given the current government shutdown that has resulted in the suspension of paychecks for federal employees and the impending loss of government supported food programs, the RH-F board voted to extend the backpack program to additional students that may not have previously qualified for the weekend bags of food. (One of our previously established criteria for receiving the backpacks was that a student needed to be eligible for free or reduced lunches.) This will be a temporary extension to the RH-F program but will continue while the need exists. The extra food certainly will not take the place of a paycheck or other food programs, but we are hopeful it will help the students and families in this current situation.

We have received many greatly needed donations this year for which we are incredibly grateful, but it's amazing how quickly those donations of food items and monetary contributions disappear when we're providing food for 45 students. With rising food prices and so many people in need, we've been unable to purchase many of our food items from the Pennsylvania Food Bank in Harrisburg, but we have some very thrifty shoppers who are continually on the look-out for best-buys, taking advantage of sales and coupons!

We appreciate your continued support of the RH-F program. You are making a difference in the lives of those students receiving the weekly bags.

"FROM OUR LIPS TO GOD'S EARS": LEARNING ABOUT PRAYER

In chapter 18 of Luke's gospel, the parable of the widow and the unjust judge, we heard how Jesus taught the disciples about the need to pray continually without losing heart. That passage inspired a lot of discussion in our church community, along with some heartfelt confessions about our lack of confidence about prayer. What is the right way to pray? And what are the right things to pray for? How do we feel God's presence in prayer?

Advent is a season of "waiting." As we prepare for our remembrance of the birth of Jesus, let's spend some of our time cultivating our knowledge about prayer and inviting a "waitful" attitude, in which we learn to be patient and calm, without anxiety and restlessness. It also sounds like the perfect antidote to the craziness of the holiday season.

St. John's will offer an Advent Prayer Series beginning on November 25th. We'll gather in the sanctuary each Tuesday evening at 7:00PM for four weeks. Each week, we'll have a brief and practical teaching about some aspect of prayer, followed by the recitation of Evening Prayer together. Our general outline will be: November 25th on the theme of Presence; December 2nd on the theme of Heart; December 9th on the theme of Wisdom and discernment; and December 16th on the theme of Communion. All members of our congregation are welcome, along with any community members who might like to share in our experience. If you have any questions, ask Pastor Wayne or Julie Falk.
