Your Pastor, SEZ...

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, even so I am sending you." John 20:19-21

I like how the resurrected Jesus meets the needs of his disciples. There they are, terrified and confused, locked up in a room together for fear of being arrested by the same people who killed Jesus. They have heard wild reports all day—Jesus' body is missing, the tomb is open, and some women even claim they have seen Him! But they themselves are still in doubt and fear.

And then Jesus comes to them and declares, "Peace be with you!" It's a standard greeting, but it's also exactly what they need first of all—the peace that comes from knowing that God has you in His hands and everything will ultimately be all right. Then He shows them His hands and side, where He carries His wounds from the cross. Why? So they can be sure that this is Jesus Himself. There He is, their own dear Lord and teacher - alive and well.

And then the commission. Jesus sends them out to pass on these same gifts of peace and joy to the people of the world, to everyone who will believe in Him. He gives them the Holy Spirit to be with them forever—and with Him.

As Jesus' disciples in this time and place he gives us these gifts today - peace, joy, forgiveness, and his presence with us through the gifts of his Word and in Baptism and Communion. He knows that we will go through many hard times while we are waiting for his return. Jesus refuses to let us go through suffering alone. And so he gives us himself even now as we wait for the day he returns in glory.

Christ is risen! Alleluia! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Ruth's Harvest-Fairfield – April 7, 2024

Seven more packings to go as of this writing, and another school year for Ruth's Harvest-Fairfield (RH-F)will be in the bag (pun intended)!

We received donations of over 400 food items from the church sponsored St. Patrick's Day party on March 17, and from the pictures posted on the bulletin board, it looks as if everyone who could attend had a great time. Many thanks to all those who have donated food items for RH-F.

As this school year draws to a close, the number of bags packed has dropped from a high of 72 bags per week to 62 bags per week. This number is still the highest number we've had at this time of year in any of the eight years we've packed bags for students in the Fairfield Area School District. We continue to pack special bags for those students who cannot have food dyes in their food items, for other students who have significant allergies to peanuts and cinnamon, and to kindergarten students for whom the bags of food were just a little too heavy for them to carry. We check every food item for the presence of food dyes, peanuts and cinnamon.

We substitute Nutella for peanut butter, and students who can't have food dyes, don't receive Jell-o because all Jell-o has food dye of one color or another. You might be surprised, because I know I was, that so many of our prepackaged foods have food dye just to make them more pleasing to the eye and our palates. Also interesting is that many European countries have banned the use of dyes in food because of the negative impact dyes can have on some people.

We also provide smaller portions of some foods for kindergarten students to decrease the weight of the bags. Examples include: smaller Chef Boyardee, smaller cans of soup, smaller juice boxes, etc. We are still in need of certain food items for the final weeks of school. Specific needs at this time are: Green beans – individual cups, Corn - individual cups Mixed fruit - individual cups Peaches - individual cups Peanut Butter to Go Cereal – individual boxes As always, thank you very much for all the donations we have received this year in food items, monetary contributions and time. This outreach could not continue without your help and that of the community as a whole.
