Your Pastor, RevSEZ...

It is difficult for me to comprehend that summer is almost over as I write this article. I'm already two months into my second-year contract as your Interim Pastor. As we look to the Fall there are already some preliminary plans underway for St. John to expand our ministry. We are hoping to schedule a Fall planning retreat for Council and other members of the congregation who would like to be involved in looking to planning the future of St. John's ministries.

Along these same lines we are formally developing an Evangelism Committee that will look at ways of sharing God's love with those who are unchurched in our area, as well as continuing to develop our hospitality with those who worship or use our facilities. We will be looking at the "church roster" to identify our active membership. There are quite a few who have not worshipped since COVID or before. Our constitution states that voting members must have communed and made a contribution of record within the current or preceding year. In order to have our records accurately reflect our membership we will be contacting those that we have not seen or heard from in several years to determine what their status is. I am hoping that we can also host a "Bring A Friend Back Again Sunday" to give us an opportunity to invite and welcome back those who have gotten out of the worship habit during COVID.

Lastly, we will be exploring ways to get our laity more involved in ministry. I'm contracted to work approximately 15 hours a week, but that time is becoming stretched with increased demands. We'll be exploring ways to assist in the ministries of the church. One such way is to develop lay eucharistic ministers who would help take communion to the ill and homebound.


Stay tuned... many exciting things are in the works for a bright future.

Vocal and instrumental solos, duets, etc are also welcome. Please contact Carol Garman for more information on any of the musical ministry groups of St. John.




KIDS CLUB
